WASTE OF MILLIONS CHARGED BY MILITARY COMMITTEE.

Twelve Hundred Training Planes Costing \$6,000,000 Junked Because of

WASHINGTON, July 22.—Waste of millions of dollars in experimenting with the English, Bristol and other types of airplanes will be reported to Congress by the Senate military sub-committee investigating aircraft profuction, members of the committee said

Other findings of the committee, said Senator Thomas, chairman of the com-mittee, and other members, will be that 1200 training planes costing \$6,000,000 recently were "junked" because they were too dangerous for use; that several aviators have been killed in flights with dangerous types of planes, and that amateurs in the engineering and administrative sections have con-

tributed to the delay in production.

Responsibility for part of the delay was placed on the former aircraft production board, but they said that the prospects for the future are much im-

All members of the committee were agreed that the Liberty motor is a complete success. It is too heavy for the Britsol plane, Senators said, and that type had been abandoned by the War Department.



The Belgian laurel is an immortally green plant; snow nor ice nor sleet never dims its verdure. Possibly it is typical of the spirit of the stricken but brave little country now writhing under the German heel.
