WO CONTRACTS FOR ROADS LET
Elgin-Minam and Union-Telocasset Highways to Be Benefited.

COUNTY COURT GETS WORK
Bids Tendered the State Highway Commission Range From \$9000 to \$20,000 Lower Than Those of Next Highest Bidder.

Contracts for grading 2.55 miles of the Elgin-Minam road and six miles of the Union-Telocasset section of the old Oregon Trail were awarded yesterday by the State Highway Commission to the County Court of Union County on bids of \$27,410 and \$27,484, respectively.

Both of these roads are postroad projects and will be constructed in cooperation with the Federal Government. The state and the Government have each appropriated \$15,000 for the work.
