

"WOMAN AND BABY" DESTROY U-BOAT

"Infant" Hurlled Into Open Hatch of Submarine Blows Bottom Out of Craft.

"Q" SHIPS DO GOOD WORK

Revelations Made Concerning One Phase of British Warfare Against Enemy Divers - Schooner Gladys M. Hollett Sunk.

LONDON, Aug. 6.—Revelations regarding the work of British mystery craft known as "Q" ships, which have played an important part in anti-submarine warfare, are made by the naval correspondent of the Times.

How a "woman and baby," accounted for a U-boat is told by the correspondent. The submarine ordered a vessel to surrender and fired a few shells into her. The boats then left the ship, leaving on board a woman who had run up and down the deck with a baby in her arms as if mad.

Haystack Conceals Battery. On another occasion a retired Admiral, serving as a captain, placed a haystack on board an ancient looking craft. When the U-boat ordered her to surrender the Germans were astonished to receive a broadside from the haystack.

A CANADIAN ATLANTIC PORT. Aug. 6.—The British schooner Gladys M. Hollett, 180 tons net register, was added to the list of victims of the German submarine warfare of the Canadian coast shortly after she was sunk by bombs shortly after 10 A. M. yesterday while on her way to New York with a cargo of herring from Twillingate, N. F.

The Hollett, after being robbed, was sunk by bombs placed in her hold, the bombs being exploded soon after Captain Cluett and his men had taken to their boats. They rowed until they reached a buoy at 11 P. M. and anchored to it until dawn.

Two boatloads of survivors of the oil tanker Erie, torpedoed by a German submarine off this port yesterday, were towed into the harbor today. They said their ship fought the U-boat for three hours before being torpedoed.

HALIFAX, N. S., Aug. 6.—To stimulate interest in search for possible German supply bases on the Nova Scotia coast or the Bay of Fundy, the Halifax Herald and Evening Mail today offered a reward of \$5000 for information leading to their location.

One of the women lost in the torpedoing of the ambulance transport Warfield was Mrs. Violet Long, chief controller of the British Women's Army Auxiliary Corps.

PANAMA, Aug. 6.—News was received here today that the tug Regiance, founded off Colon yesterday. Five members of the crew were lost.

NEW YORK, Aug. 6.—The Reliance was formerly the M. E. Scully, and was built in 1904 for work in New York harbor. She was purchased by the Government during construction of the Panama Canal. Before the waterway was completed the tug made a trip with three barges around South America.

EARL ARRIVES IN LONDON

British Ambassador to Hold Conference With War Cabinet.

NEW YORK, Aug. 6.—The Earl of Reading, British Ambassador and High Commissioner to the United States, has arrived in London, it was announced here today by the British Bureau of Information. His mission is to confer with the British War Cabinet. It was said during his absence Colville Barclay will be in charge of the British Embassy, the bureau announced. Sir Richard Crawford will continue in charge of the British War Mission in the United States.

YANKS REPEL HUNS

Accuracy of American Fire Drives Enemy Back.

LONDON, Aug. 6.—The official communication on aerial operations issued by the War Office tonight says: "On August 5 our airplanes carried out reconnaissance and observations for our artillery. Very few enemy machines were sighted and there were no combats."

RAIN CHECKS ACTIVITIES

U. S. Machine Gunners, Protecting Point on Vesle River, Wipe Out Whole Battalion.

ROME, Aug. 6.—The official statement issued by the War Office today reads: "On the Asiago Plateau in the Monte Grappa region and along the Lower Piave there has been greater artillery activity. Our batteries blew up an army ammunition dump along the river."

Peasants Found in Cave

Ninety French peasants who had been living in a large cave near Ville-Savoie, southwest of Fismes, were rescued by the Americans after having passed through two battles and remaining in the cave for several weeks.

Food Supply Scant

Many shells had struck close to the front, several exploding directly over the place where the peasants had taken refuge, but the thick rock and earth roof was not damaged.

Yanks Commended for Valor

WITH THE AMERICAN ARMY IN FRANCE, Aug. 6.—(By the Associated Press.)—Two enemy raids in the Vosges were beaten off yesterday evening by the Americans.

PARIS, Aug. 6.—Aside from artillery activity east of Soissons and on the Vesle River, there is nothing to report from the whole of the front," says the French official communication, issued this evening.

Enemy Quiet in Albania

The remainder of the communication follows: "Army of the East, Aug. 5.—There has been artillery activity on the Struma, Vardar and the Cerna bend and to the north of Monastir."

LONDON, Aug. 6.—The Germans, by a strong local attack against British positions along the Bray-Corbis road north of the Somme, succeeded in taking advanced trench lines on a small portion of the front.

British Take Prisoners

Local fighting continues in this area and the British have taken a few prisoners, according to the War Office statement tonight. The text of the statement says: "At dawn this morning the enemy launched a strong local attack against our new positions south of Morlan-court, near the Bray-Corbis road. The assault, delivered by a division from the reserve, succeeded in carrying our advanced trench lines on a portion of the ground captured by us on the night of July 28-29. Local fighting is still taking place in this area and a few prisoners have been taken by our troops."

British Outposts Advanced

"Southeast of Robecq our posts in the Pascaut Wood sector have been further advanced on a front of about 2000 yards. A few prisoners also were captured by us in this area."

HUN HATE REVEALED

Demand Made U. S. Prisoners Be Not Exchanged.

The French north of Montdidier have crossed to the west side of the Avre River between Branches and Morisel. Here a fairly deep penetration into the German line would become a direct menace to the junction point of the armies of the German Crown Prince and of Crown Prince Rupprecht. On both sides of Amiens, where the Germans have given ground, they now are heavily selling British positions.

BITTER COMMENT MADE

Hamburg Paper Insists That in Case Americans Are Released Their Cases Should Be Last to Be Considered.

AMSTERDAM, Aug. 6.—Discussing the proposed exchange of American and German war prisoners, the Nachrichten, of Hamburg, advises the German government to reject all such overtures on the following grounds: "First—The Americans, by this agreement, would enjoy exceptional treatment, which, besides being unfair to the other prisoners, would enormously facilitate recruiting in America."

3 KILLINGS DUE TO MONEY

Canova, S. D., Triple Murder Is Traced to Financial Dispute.

CANOVIA, S. D., Aug. 6.—A Coroner's jury summoned to investigate the triple shooting tragedy in the Royal Hotel here last night decided that Mrs. F. M. Dexter, wife of a local banker, was shot and killed by the woman who gave her name as Mrs. J. L. Williams, of Anderson, Mo.; that Mrs. Williams in turn was slain by Williams, who then killed himself, firing a bullet into his right temple.

STOCK BROKER PAROLED

George Graham Rice, Alias Herzig, Pleads Not Guilty of Fraud.

NEW YORK, Aug. 6.—Jacob Simon Herzig, alias George Graham Rice, stock broker indicted by a Federal grand jury yesterday on the charge of using the mails to defraud, pleaded not guilty in the Federal Court here today, and pending the filing of a \$10,000 bond, was paroled in the custody of his counsel.

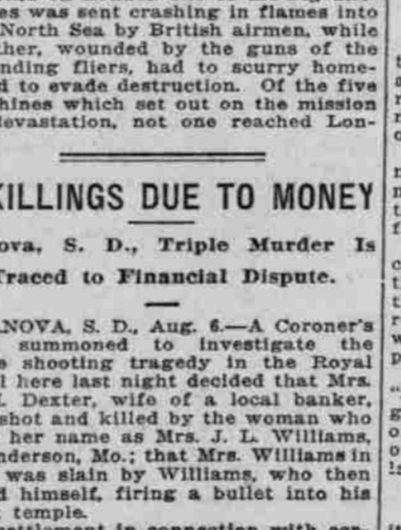

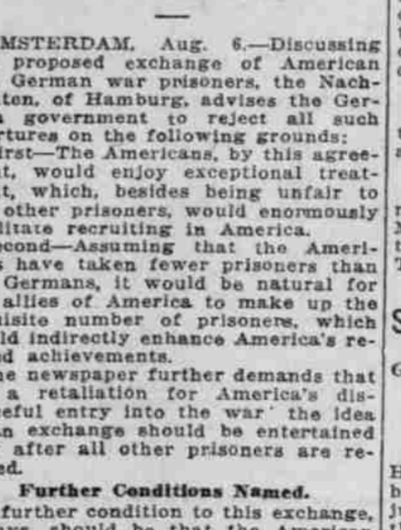
