MANY RAINCOATS LEAKY

OVER 28,000 STORED AT BROOKLYN FOUND DEFECTIVE.

Seventeen Manufacturers Involved in Army Order and Many Indietments Are Returned.

NEW YORK, Aug. 9 .- More than 28,-686 Army raincoats, similar in poor material and workmanship to a large number of supposedly waterproof garments delfvered to American soldiers overseas, have been found defective by inspectors who tonight reported progress of an examination of Government stores at Brooklyn warehouses.

Federal officials announced 55,000 raincoats, withheld from shipment when General Pershing forwarded from France complaints of leaky storm garments issued to thousauds of his troops, have already been reinspected. Of these more than 51 per cent were rejected, it was stated it was stated.

Approximately 19,000 coats of con-signments in possession of the War De-partment at this port remin to be ex-

Details of the reinspections, which involve thus far 17 manufacturers, were, made public by authority of the Army Quartermaster's Corps and Assistant United States Attorney Huston Thomp-son, who have co-operated in the investigation of alleged graft in raincoat

The inquiry has resulted in the indictment of more than a score of in-dividuals and corporations, among them Captain Aubrey Vaughn, of the Quartermaster's Department.
