In reference to the proposed increase in express rates, the Oregon Commis-sion has refused to sanction the pro-posed advance of 15 per cent because it would curtail markets to the producer on interstate traffic, and as to intrastate business the express companies had pledged that certain estab-lished rates should not be disturbed, and it was in support of this under-standing in connection with other facts
