

BARLEY FOR CROP

Threshing of Oats Indicates Yield of Small Size.

WHEAT HARVEST DELAYED

Prune Picking and Drying Will Begin Next Week in Southern Counties, About Two Weeks Earlier Than Usual Date.

Crop and weather conditions in Oregon in the past week are summarized by the Weather Bureau as follows:

The week was one of variable temperatures, with a few opening days, and with maximum temperatures of 100 degrees or above during the latter part.

"Barley was only a fair crop in most places and was not yielding as well as expected in Western Oregon, where showers caused considerable damage to hay and grain which was ready for harvest.

"Wheat was only a fair crop in most places and was not yielding as well as expected in Western Oregon, where showers caused considerable damage to hay and grain which was ready for harvest.

"The peach crop in the country yesterday totaled 132 cars. Colorado led with 74 cars, Washington shipped 29 and California 14. Oregon also shipped 24 cars to market, not included in the above total.

"Butterfat prices are advanced. Recent rise in egg quotations not maintained; Geese wanted for Jewish holidays.

"Recent advance in egg prices was the top price obtainable yesterday on Oregon candled stock in large lots. Eastern eggs, mainly Kansas 29-day candled, are being offered at 10c.

"Butter was firm and an early advance in cube prices was indicated by the higher buying quotation of 58 cents for butterfat put out by the city agencies. No change in price in print prices, but a slight advance in price of butterfat.

"Pears slow and unboxed. Liberal receipts of pears, mostly home-grown, and a slow demand unsettled the market. Arrivals also included 100 boxes of Oregon pears by express and 1 car and 100 boxes of Washington pears by express.

"Over 1000 boxes of tomatoes in. Potatoes are steady, with lighter receipts—Onions are unchanged.

"The onion market held even with most of the week. Prices on the street ranged from \$1.25 to \$1.50 per bushel. One car arrived from Washington.

"There was a good demand for tomatoes, but the heavy receipts caused a slightly weaker market. Receipts unwrapped stock sold generally at 75 cents and poorer grades as low as 35 cents. Receipts were 100 boxes by express and about 1000 boxes by boat.

"Pears slow and unboxed. Liberal receipts of pears, mostly home-grown, and a slow demand unsettled the market. Arrivals also included 100 boxes of Oregon pears by express and 1 car and 100 boxes of Washington pears by express.
