

G.O.P. RETAINS ITS CONTROL IN MAINE

Early Returns Indicate That Senator Fernald and Four Congressmen Win.

LEGISLATURE SEEMS SAFE

Democrats Cut Deeply Into Republican Vote; Much Interest Exists in Today's Primary in Washington State.

PORLTAND, Me., Sept. 9.—The Democrats made deep inroads in the Republican vote in the elections in Maine today, but early returns indicated that the Republicans still had control from the Republicans.

On the face of figures from five-sixths of the state it appeared that United States Senator Bert M. Fernald, Republican, had probably all four Republicans Congressmen had been returned to office.

Senator Fernald ran far ahead of the remainder of the ticket. The indications were that he would have a margin of well over 13,000 votes.

For the first time the民票 plurality appeared likely to reach 7000.

Figures for 553 precincts out of 626 in the state gave: For Senator Fernald, Rep., 61,688; Newbert, Dem., 49,622.

For Governor—Milliken, Rep., 58,786; McIntire, Dem., 48,451.

Early legislative returns indicated that the Republicans would continue in control in both branches.

SEATTLE, Wash., Sept. 9.—(Special)—The state-wide primary election tomorrow has attracted little interest and interest is dying down, the fact that five Congressmen and five Judges of the State Supreme Court are to be nominated, as well as the members who will compose the House and part of the Senate of the next Legislature.

First Opposition Likely.

In the First, Second and Third Congressional Districts, Representatives John F. Miller, Lin H. Hadley and Albert Johnson, Republican, are without serious opposition and will be re-nominated.

In the Fourth District Representative W. L. La Follette, Republican, will probably be defeated for renomination, either by Dr. John W. Summers, of Walla Walla, or Arthur E. Mires, of Ellensburg, his principal opponents.

McBroskey Wins on Democratic Side.

The Democratic candidate will be Will H. McBroskey, of Monroe.

In the Fifth District Judge J. Stanley Webster, Republican, who resigned from the Supreme Court bench to make the race for Congress, will be nominated against Representative Clarence C. Dill, Democrat, but the renomination of Dill by his own party is not considered certain by many means. Judge T. V. Tamm, of Spokane, is making a strenuous fight against him.

La Follette and Dill are opposed in their own parties because of their unsatisfactory record on war legislation.

Tolman Seems Stronger.

The State Court situation offers little excitement, except in the election of a Justice for the two years' term. Judge Warren W. Tolman, incumbent, opposed by Judge Walter M. French, of Kitsap County.

Judge John F. Main, Wallace Mount, and John R. Mitchell, incumbents, are expected to win in the primaries for the same seats. Judge Kenneth Mackintosh, also appointed by Governor Lister, is unopposed for the four-year term.

In King County interest centers on the contest for Prosecuting Attorney, Sheriff and County Commissioners. Fred C. Brown is believed to be in the lead, with Samuel Brackett, Chief Deputy Prosecuting Attorney, his chief opponent. Six other men are opposed for renomination by Robert Hodge.

Judge Clay Allen, who was appointed to the Superior Court bench by Governor Lister, is strongly opposed by organized labor for renomination. Judge Calvin S. Hall, another Lister appointee, is expected to be renominated. Ex-Congressman Thomas Reesland and Judge and Congressman Dudley G. Wooster are strongly backed for the local bench.

SPOKANE, Wash., Sept. 9.—(Special)—Chief interest in the primaries tomorrow centers in the Tustin-Dill race for the Democratic nomination for Congress.

Tamm appears the favorite, having toured the district systematically and having had the support of practically all the leaders of the Democratic party.

Webster Conceded Winner.

Judge Webster is generally conceded the winner in the Republican primaries.

HELENA, Mont., Sept. 9.—Declaring that "we deplore the seeming efforts that are being made in certain quarters by the party in power in the state to turn the state's means of promoting party advantage and gaining party power," the platform reported to the Republican state convention here today promises to use "the force and power of our organization to the utmost in aiding the vigorous and efficient promotion of the welfare of the state."

The platform condemns the fixing of prices for wheat and wool while no price is fixed for cotton, and recommends the fixing of prices for wheat flour substitutes. It indorses National and state prohibition and woman suffrage.
