

MORE BUTTER HELD

Storage Stocks in Northwest Larger Than Year Ago.

INCREASE 13.4 PER CENT

Holdings of Eggs Have Fallen Off 12.3 Per Cent—Cheese Supply Is Also Lighter Than on Same Date Last Year.

Although storage stocks of creamery butter in the United States on September 1 were 67 per cent less than a year before, the holdings of butter in Pacific Northwest storages gained 13.4 per cent in that time.

A comparison of egg holdings in the Northwest on September 1 shows a decline of 12.3 per cent and for the country as a whole a decline of 2.8 per cent as against a year ago.

American cheese stocks in the Northwest are 37.1 per cent less and in the United States 46.8 per cent less than last year. Swiss and block cheese in the Northwest decreased 77.1 per cent, while holdings in the entire country gained 18.8 per cent.
