Preceding the meeting at the Auditorium all officers and work-ers will form in parade at 7:15 o'clock, under their colonels. For-mation points will be on Park street, between Mill and Colum-

For the purpose of firing both public and workers alike with zeal of the fourth loan, and to retrieve Portland from the apathy that has thus far marked the drive for liberty dollars, a "Portland Must Win" parade will be held tonight at 7:15, when 5000 workers of the loan will march through downtown streets to the Auditorium. The meeting at the Auditorium will be called to order at 8 o'clock.

With many bands, and with banners bearing wartime slogans, the workers will form a mighty demonstration that is calculated to shake the city into wakefulness and make possible the completion of the \$19,000,000 quota by Saturday noon."

At the Auditorium meeting there will be no lengthy or tiresome programme. Dr. E. H. Pence, whose patriotic ora-tory has stirred many Portland audi-ences, will deliver the message of urgency to the loan crusaders.
