

STATE POLICE HELD UP ON LIQUOR CHARGES

Medford Officers Break Up Hilarious Party.

SMITHERS PLEADS GUILTY

Special Agents Said to Have Made Only One Arrest in Southern Oregon in Two Months.

MEDFORD, Or., Oct. 18.—(Special)—That Sergeant C. S. Triplet and Police Officer Charles Smithers, of the State Police, who have been in Southern Oregon for the past two months rounding up bootleggers, have themselves been frequent violators of the bone dry law.

These two officers have been stationed in the Shakyous for several months for the special purpose of catching professional bootleggers smuggling whisky into Oregon from California.

Feeling sure of his ground, the chief obtained a search warrant yesterday afternoon and shortly after midnight made the raid.
