

# EARLY CLOSING RULE BLOW TO CANDIDATES

### Rushlight and Baines Ousted for City Commissioner.

## LEGAL PROTEST IS FILED

### Mrs. Louise Palmer Weber, in Boosting Walter Pierce, Recommends Governor for Re-Election.

Both A. G. Rushlight and Arthur B. Baines are ousted as candidates for City Commissioner in the coming municipal election, according to the opinion of City Attorney LaRoche. City Auditor Funk so notified Mr. Rushlight and Mr. Baines, and these men will institute mandamus proceedings to have their names placed on the ballot.

Mr. Rushlight will be represented by Waldemar Seaton. Frederick W. Mulkey is representing Mr. Baines. Wilson T. Hume is representing a taxpayer, not named. These three will look after the mandamus proceedings, probably this morning.

Dr. T. L. Perkins, a dentist, filed Tuesday afternoon for the short term of seven months. About 5:30 o'clock Mr. Rushlight also filed. In the past it has been customary for nominating petitions to be filed up to practically midnight on the last day, but Dr. Perkins conceived the idea that if a ruling could be obtained that the Auditor's office closes officially at 5 P. M., he would have a cinch on the election and draw the City Commissioner's salary for seven months, the compensation being approximately \$231, a sum not to be sneezed at.

**Legal Protest Is Filed.**  
Gus C. Moser, recent candidate for the Republican nomination for Governor, appeared as Dr. Perkins' attorney, and filed a protest against Mr. Rushlight's name appearing on the ballot for the short term in opposition to his client. Auditor Funk passed the protest to the City Attorney for opinion. Mr. LaRoche ruled that the hours for official business have been set by the Council as from 8 A. M. to 5 P. M., and that a nominating petition filed after 5 o'clock could not be accepted. This ruling also shut out Mr. Baines, who had filed shortly before 7 P. M., as a candidate for the long term of four years.

"Tuesday was the last day for filing," observed Mr. Rushlight over the telephone last night. "The Auditor's office being home sick with grippe," and it was Tuesday all day and up to midnight. When Mr. Barber was City Auditor he accepted nominating petitions, many of them, long after 5 o'clock of the last day, and there was no attempt to keep any of these late filings off the ballot. The Auditor's office was open and I filed; had the office been closed I could not have presented my petition. My friends—I am here with a sick family—are looking after the situation and will bring mandamus proceedings to keep my name on the ballot."

**Perkins Has Clear Field.**  
If Mr. Rushlight and Mr. Baines are kept out of the election by Dr. Perkins, it will have some important bearings on the result. For instance, this will leave Dr. Perkins with a clear field, unless someone's name should be written in so existing. The Auditor's office would be defeated—and it requires a stretch of the imagination to expect such an outcome.

Also it reduces the number of candidates for the long term to four: C. A. Bigelow and Dan Kelsler, incumbents; S. C. Pier and Oscar W. Horne. And where there are two places to fill and only four candidates the Auditor's choice does not apply. In other words, each candidate would have his fate determined without the assistance of second choice voters. This means that two places to fill and only four candidates, an elector could vote for the bunch, giving first choice to two and second choice to the remaining pair.

There is no doubt but that the second choice votes were being depended on by one or more candidates to pull them through, and the opinion of the City Attorney now deprives them of this hopeful reserve strength. Because of this, Mr. LaRoche's ruling baffles Messrs. Rushlight and Baines affecting the candidacy of all the men running for the long term.

Mrs. Louise Palmer Weber, the industrious epistolary campaign manager for Walter M. Pierce, Democratic candidate for Governor, is now informing Governor Witherby. Mrs. Weber's effort is intended to boost Mr. Pierce, but it is actually a recommendation for Governor Witherby. She wants men elected who will support the President's war programme, and Governor Witherby made a record in doing that. In fact, a Government official is quoted as saying that Governor Witherby stands higher at Washington than any other Governor by reason of his promptness in carrying out such part of the war programme as has been assigned to him.

J. L. Day, chairman of the Republican County Central Committee, is sending out the following letter to practically the same list of women who received Mrs. Weber's communication:

"Dear Madam: Many of the prominent club women of Portland are receiving a letter from Louise Palmer Weber on the subject of the National League for Democracy, dated October 14. Mrs. Weber is a paid secretary in the office of W. M. Pierce, Democratic candidate for Governor, and a recent participant in the Non-Partisan League organization meetings.

"This particular letter strongly indorses the election of men who will support the President's war programme. We are taking this opportunity of indorsing the sentiment here expressed, and calling your attention to the fact that our representatives in the United States Senate and Congress have voted in support of the Administration on every measure advocated by the President.

"The war programme of our Governor is one of which every Oregonian can be proud. It is pointed to as an example from one end of our nation to the other. He has used every means at his command to back up the boys who are so nobly sacrificing themselves that our Nation might live, and we are asking you to do the same. Remind Americans, to forget the camouflage slogan, 'politics is adjourned,' and get your friends out to the polls, that the men who have made good may be sustained.

"Judge Bennett, of The Dalles, is yielding a little bit to the requests and suggestions of friends that he be a candidate for the vacancy on the Supreme Court bench. Judge Bennett has consulted with a number of Democrats and asked their opinion. He believes that he would draw more labor votes than any other candidate mentioned.
