Announcement Is Made by Administrator Green.

No More Distributions at Present Against Army Contracts, but Navy Orders to Be Taken Care Of.

With the ending of the war, wool is again available for certain purposes. Manufacturers are now being notified that certain quantities of the raw material will be distributed among the mills for other than Army use.

Press reports from the East indicate that the War Industries Board may be dissolved, but it is understood that plans will be made to continue the distribution of raw materials.
