

GRAY HUPMOBILE IS SOUGHT BY OFFICERS

Reward of \$2000 Offered for Capture of Murderer.

POLICE COMB ENTIRE CITY

Inspectors Say Crime Savors With Methods Employed by Drug Fiend or Weak-Minded Youth.

Owners of all gray Hupmobile automobiles bearing Oregon licenses are liable to be called upon to account for their whereabouts at 11:10 P. M. Tuesday.

The make of the auto was noticed by Privates Clyde R. Mills and P. E. Korinek, of Vancouver Barracks, while the driver was holding up C. G. Herrman, a tender on the Interstate bridge, and robbing him of \$1500.

Deputy Sheriff Beckman secured an alphabetical list of the owners of Hupmobile machines in Oregon within half an hour of the shooting.

A reward of \$2000 was offered yesterday for the capture of the highwayman and his woman companion. One-half will be paid by the Interstate Bridge Commission and the rest by Multnomah County.

The bullet that killed Twomey destroyed the only sure clue to the murderer's identity, in the opinion of officials who worked on the case yesterday.

The Deputy, who was on duty chasing speeders on the county roads, probably threw the headlight of his motorcycle on the license number of the automobile as he overhauled the car. The robber evidently knew this.

Police believe the highwayman shot to kill, because he realized that the license number would be irrefutable evidence against him.

Deputy Sheriff Christofferson and Beckman, assisted by Chief Inspector Clark, Detective Captain Circle and the whole police and Sheriff's force, took up the trail within a few minutes after the shooting.

The robbery and murder, police point out, evidently was the work of a drug fiend or a weak-minded boy. The sum likely to be on hand in a pay station on the bridge was not sufficient, police believe, to tempt a professional criminal with courage to attempt so bold a crime.

SALMON LAW HAS FLAW

Columbia River Three-Mile Limit Act Held to Be Not Enforceable.

OLYMPIA, Wash., Nov. 20.—(Special)—Although police authority of the state to prohibit possession or sale of salmon within the state if caught during the closed season outside the three-mile limit of the Columbia River is fully sustained by the Supreme Court, the act itself is held to be not enforceable, in the case against Isaac Belknap, a fisherman, who has appealed from Judge H. Ewen's order sustaining Belknap's demurrer.

Charles Pickleman, of the Riverview Cozy, applied to the authorities at Vancouver to help find the boy. The party left Vancouver about 7:30 A. M. and spent the day hunting.

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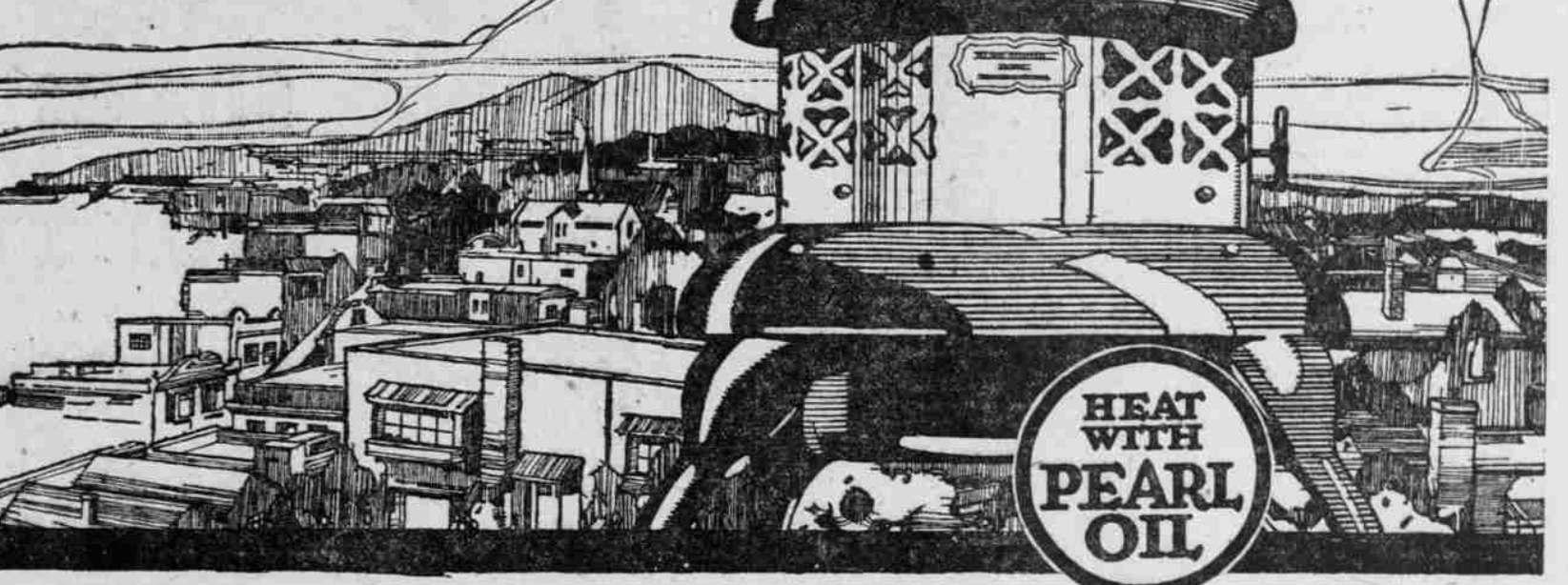

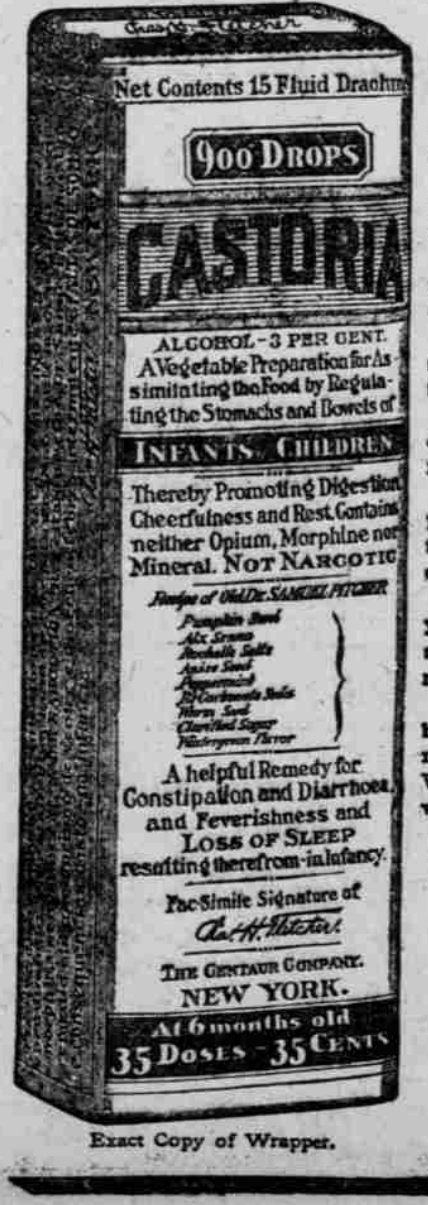
