RED CROSS WORK LARGE

PORTLAND ORGANIZATION DOES MUCH IN ELEVEN MONTHS.

Report Shows That Receipts for Period Total \$311,000, With but \$6600 Paid for Salaries.

Reports of the varied activities of the Portland Chapter of the American Red Cross, given at the annual meeting held last night in Central Library hall, constitute strong testimonials to the efficiency and spirit with which the following were chosen as directors: Three-year term, Mrs. Julius Louison, John F. Daly, Donald W. Greene, Miss Henrietta Failing, Ralph Hahn, W. F. Lipman, Dr. K. A. J. MacKenzie, W. E. Coman, Mrs. Alice Benson Beach, Mrs. D. Honeyman, Mrs. W. J. Burns, Rabbi Jonah B. Wise, Directors in full vacancies by re-elections, Mrs. Ferdinand E. Reed, C. C. Rose.

The report of Amedee M. Smith, general manager, showed cash on hand at the end of 11 months, \$106,524, while receipts for the same period were \$311,000. The total amount paid for salaries was \$6,600, and is for clerical help alone.

Major I. Lowengart, chairman of the military relief section, presented a report on the activities of that division, which has jurisdiction over the districts of Portland, Oregon City, Tillamook, McMinnville, Forest Grove, Newberg and Hillsboro.

The report of Mrs. Ferdinand E. Reed, commander of the Red Cross canteen, covering the period from August to November, showed that canteen service had been extended to 31,000 soldiers, 2900 sailors, 1000 marines, 6500 drafted men and 115 ill.

Other reports were read by Dr. Frederick H. Valentine, chairman of the medical committee; Miss M. Blumauer, chairman of the Junior Red Cross committee; R. E. Frazer, chairman of Belgian relief; and Mr. C. C. Rose, chairman of the salvage division, whose sales report showed a total of \$20,424 for 11 months, and Mrs. Jessie H. Stearns, chairman of the Christmas parcels committee, who reported that 4500 cartons had been sent to France.
