Bill Carefully Drafted.

Mr. Marshall, chairman of the committee on Poland, in presenting the bill of rights to the congress, explained that it was drafted jointly by four committees that have been considering committees that have been considering conditions in Russia, Poiand, Galicia, Lithuania, Ukrainia and the new Slovak nations. The report, presented by Mr Marshall, recommended the following. "That the American Jewish congress respectfully requests the peace conference to insert in the treaty of peace as conditions precedent to the creation of the new or enlarged states which it is proposed to call into being, that ex-press provision be made a part of the constitutions of such states before they shall be finally recognized as states by the signatories of the treaty, as fol-


