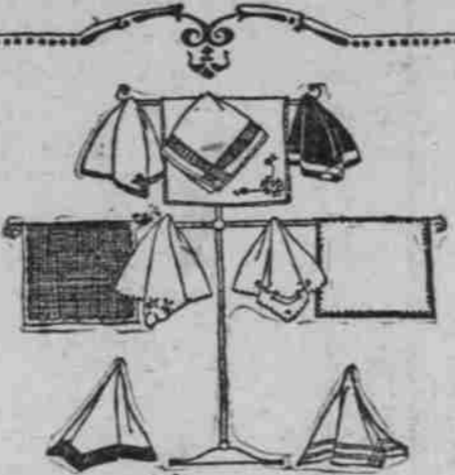

**ROLAND BEAVER IS DEAD**

**PORTLAND BOY SUCCEEDS IN GERMAN PRISON CAMP.**

**Charles W. Beaver Recalls Day When He Found Helmet and Belt Belonging to Brother.**

Roland Beaver, of Portland, captured by Germans on the Chateau Thierry section on July 15, died in the prison camp at Raastatt, of spinal meningitis, September 29. This was told in a letter received yesterday by his brother, Charles W. Beaver.  
The Beaver brothers were members of the famous 30th Infantry that stopped the German drive before Chateau Thierry. Roland was captured while on duty at a listening post. When the barrage was put down by the Germans, the young Portlander was instructed to report to his brother, who was in command of a battery of French guns. Charles heard the telephone bell ring, and rushed to the receiver. The line was "dead." After making his way through the barrage to the listening post, he found a helmet and belt belonging to his brother. It was not known definitely until yesterday what had become of Roland. The Beaver brothers, who resided at 242 Blandena street, Portland, enlisted at Vancouver in January, 1918, and were immediately sent to France. There they transferred to the gunnery section, and after short training went into the fight at Hill 504.  
Charles W. Beaver is the only surviving member of the band of brave lads who stood coolly behind their guns as the German waves came down the hills. He has suffered four wounds. He wears the Croix de Guerre and the Forasaur.

**COFFEE RISE IS EXPLAINED**

**OUTSIDE INTERESTS HELD FOR WAR INCREASES.**

**Acting State Food Administrator Says United States Has No Control Over Prices.**

**CENTRALIA WANTS NORMAL**

Members of Legislature Asked to Introduce Bill.  
CENTRALIA, Wash., Dec. 20.—(Special.)—At a meeting held last night in the local Commercial Club rooms a resolution was adopted "respectfully requesting H. W. Thompson and the other members of the Legislature from Lewis County to use their best efforts in advocating the location of a normal school within the incorporated limits of the city of Centralia, and that H. W. Thompson be especially requested to use his best efforts and endeavors toward the passage of a bill having in view this object, and that he introduce at the earliest possible opportunity a bill for this purpose and vigorously advocate its passage."

**HOOD RIVER BOY HONORED**

Howard Cooper Assigned to Stevens Academy.  
HOOD RIVER, Or., Dec. 20.—Howard Cooper, who has been in charge of the squad engaged in the study of steam engineering at the Pelham Bay school of the Navy, has been promoted to a course of intensive study at Stevens Academy at Hoboken, N. J. The young man's parents, Mr. and Mrs. W. F. Cooper, have been informed by the Pelham Bay commandant that young Cooper is the youngest man ever to have been similarly honored and his grade is the highest ever attained in a similar examination.  
Cooper, formerly a student at the Oregon Agricultural College, is 21 years old.

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**Acting State Food Administrator Says United States Has No Control Over Prices.**

The fact that coffee has nearly doubled in cost is due to the manipulation of producers and dealers outside of the United States, over which the Federal Food Administration has no control," explained W. K. Newell, Acting State Food Administrator.  
Under the Federal food regulations no dealer is permitted to have on hand more than a 90 days' supply. This prevents any extensive hoarding in anticipation of any increase in price. The importer of coffee now and throughout the period of the war has been limited to a 5 per cent margin of profit over the actual cost to him. The jobber likewise is limited to a profit of 7 1/2 per cent and is required to sell each lot of coffee on the basis of its cost price regardless of any advance in the market.  
The reason for the advance in the cost of coffee to the consumer is twofold," reads a letter received by Mr. Newell from the office of the Federal Food Administrator. "In the first place, the coffee trees in the state of Sao Paulo, the greatest coffee producing country in the world, were seriously damaged by a severe frost in June last. This started the upward movement in Brazil, and Brazilian speculators started a bull campaign.  
Secondly, the notice of the armistice and figuring that with the war over there would be an enormous demand from Europe (Germany being one of the biggest markets for Brazilian coffee), speculation in that and other producing countries became rampant and still continues so."
