

NINE PRISONERS ARE KILLED BY MILITARY

Executions Follow Return of Political Fugitives.

PRISON NOW UNDER GUARD

Slaying of Men Said to Have Been Carried Out Without Knowledge Supreme Governor Kolchak.

VLADIVOSTOK, Friday, Jan. 17.—(By the Associated Press).—Of the prisoners who were released from jail at Omsk as the result of an abortive Bolshevik plot late in December, nine of those who voluntarily returned were killed by the military without the knowledge of Admiral Kolchak, the supreme governor of the Omsk government, or his Ministers, according to information that has just come to light.

The motive of the executions is obscure but the inclusion among the nine victims of several important members of the constituent assembly, prominent journalists and public leaders, points in the minds of many to the use of Bolshevik methods of intimidation and suppression of the idea of a constituent assembly.

When the jail was opened on the night of December 21, the political prisoners at first refused to leave their cells and it is said they were threatened with being shot if they persisted. They were told it is reported, that the authority of Omsk had been seized by the Bolsheviks.

The following day when it became clear that the plot had failed the government issued a proclamation urging those who had been released to return to the prisons under pain of court-martial.

COURT ACTS ON OWN LAW

Linn County Judge Construes Act Introduced When Senator.

ALBANY, Or., Jan. 19.—(Special).—The unusual act being called upon judicially to construe its terms occurred here yesterday when Judge Kelly, Circuit Judge of the Third Judicial District, construed some provisions of the Oregon law regarding the registration of titles to real property, popularly called the Torrens Land Law. This law was introduced in Oregon by Judge Kelly, when he was a state senator from Linn county about 18 years ago.



WASHINGTON MEN REACH FRANCE FROM GERMANY.
