PIEZ SENDS OUT ORDER

No Details Given of Change in Supervision of Construction of Vessels in Oregon District.

Ship construction division is the official designation of that portion of the force of the Emergency Fleet Corporation engaged in building vessels, the wooden and steel ship construction divisions having been abolished.

Notice of the change reached the city yesterday from Charles Piez, director-general of the Emergency Fleet Corporation.

In the Oregon district wooden ship construction has been directed by L. J. Wentworth for more than a year, and the steel ship work is under Fred H. Paice, assistant manager.

Further evidence of cutting down departments in the shipbuilding organization was given in copies of the Emergency Fleet News, which announces the discontinuance of publication.
