

INCOME TAX SOUGHT FOR ROAD BUILDING

Senator Pierce Would Levy on Receipts Above \$4000.

BOND ISSUE IS OPPOSED

Double Auto Fee, Gasoline Levy and Increase of Road Tax Millage Also Proposed.

STATE CAPITOL, Salem, Jan. 22.—(Special.)—Admitting that he has an income of \$20,000 a year, Senator Pierce has introduced a state income tax measure, which he believes will raise between \$1,500,000 and \$2,000,000 a year.

Unless the Legislature adopts a state income tax, asserts the Senator from Union and Willamette, the people will enact one through the initiative some day, and the Legislature may as well accept one carefully drawn, such as he has submitted.

Bonds for Roads Opposed. All incomes above \$4000 a year are taxed under the provisions of the bill, and exemptions are few. If a husband and wife have joint income of more than \$4000, the tax must be paid.

Gasoline Tax Suggested. A third source of revenue is a tax on gasoline, which he contends will add \$400,000 more, depending on the amount of tax placed on the petrol per gallon.

FEEL OF INSURANCE POLLS BEFORE HOUSE

Increased Tax on Premiums Sought by Committee.

SALARY RISE IS APPROVED

Licensing of Real Estate Dealers and Insurance Solicitors Included in Legislation.

STATE CAPITOL, Salem, Or., Jan. 22.—(Special.)—With a great of insurance bills coming in today, the most of them being introduced in the House by Representative Martin, of Marion, chairman of the committee on insurance, the proposed legislation on that subject is now largely in, with the exception of a few which may appear later.

Insurance bill provides that all notes given in payment for premiums upon all insurance policies shall have the words printed across each note—"non-negotiable." It appears that many agents have disposed of notes before the application has been accepted by the company, and when called upon to make good the note some have failed to do it.

Optometrists Ask Protection.
