University Scholarship Averages Show Men Not Up to Expectation. UNIVERSITY OF IDAHO, Moscow Feb. 8.—(Special.) — The scholarship averages of the University of Idaho for the year 1917-18 show that the women average higher than the men.

There was a slight drop in the averages of all colleges, except that of engineering, which succeeded law to sec-
