

MEXICAN OIL ORDER AFFECTS AMERICANS

Officials of State Department Studying Details.

OLD RULINGS ARE REVIVED

Permission of Federal Government Required to Drill Wells or Do Development Work.

WASHINGTON, March 25.—Officials of the state department have begun a study of the order of the department of industry in Mexico City threatening to punish foreign companies and individuals for drilling wells or doing petroleum development work without permission of the federal government.

Trouble Dates Back to 1915. The feature of the oil trouble involved in the circular order issued in Mexico City last Saturday is said to date back to January, 1915, when Carranza was chief and was beset with enemies on every side.

Decees Declared Capitulatory. Subsequent decrees were announced, each intending to put into effect article 27 of the Mexican constitution.

Whether any action will be taken by this government in the present circumstances has not yet been decided.

SITUATION IN EGYPT BECAME SERIOUS

Winston Spencer Churchill Defends Military Bill.

INSURRECTION IS FEARED

Appeals Sent to Men on Point of Demobilization to Return and Save Their Comrades.

LONDON, March 25.—(By the Associated Press.)—Defending the military situation in Egypt, Winston Spencer Churchill, secretary for war, declared that the whole of Egypt was in a virtual state of insurrection.

Situation Held Serious. Mr. Churchill asked if he followed what was taking place in almost every country at the present time, and if so, how could he say that there was over-insurance in keeping 500,000 men for every purpose, including ten divisions on the Rhine and four divisions in the home country.

Stafford, Portland timbermen, have purchased from Frestley & Hackett the old Gold Hill Lumber & Box company's sawmill plant.
