

NEW YORK EXPORTING
FACILITIES TESTEDGrain Corporation Appeals to
Private Business for Aid.

EUROPE IS IN NEED OF FOOD

Total of 1,600,000 Tons of Grain
and Cereal Products to Be Sent
Overseas in Next 30 Days.

NEW YORK, April 9.—To increase the export grain-handling facilities of the port of New York so that the grain corporation can send a total of 1,600,000 tons of grain and cereal products to Europe in the next 30 days, oat handlers of this city at a meeting today agreed to adjust their private business to release the greatest possible percentage of the port facilities for this purpose.

President Barnes of the grain corporation, who called the meeting, explained that the vital needs of various European countries for foodstuffs, investigated by the supreme economic council, made food shipments necessary to the maintenance of life and order in Europe. He asked the grain trade to co-operate by reducing amount of storage space now used in export elevators to one-half the present quantity. The estimated monthly maximum handling capacity of all Atlantic and gulf ports made a year ago, he said, was 1,300,000 tons.

Despite all the disorganization now prevailing in Europe, Mr. Barnes said, reports from Herbert Hoover showed that a steady flow of food is being maintained into Roumania and Armenia through the Dardanelles, Constantinople; into Serbia through Greece and the Adriatic; into the new republic of Czechoslovakia both by train across Austria and by barge through Germany and up the Elbe from Hamburg, and into Poland by train across Germany from Danzig, while Finland and the new Baltic states are being supplied by direct shipment across the Baltic sea.

Oils and greases are also being sent for the disorganized railways, he added, and "slowly the broken bones of commercial intercourse are being knitted."

VALUED HORSES DIE IN FIRE

LARGE BARN ON MALCOLM A.
MOODY RANCH DESTROYED.

Animals Lost Include Several Pure-Bred Stallions—J. W. Carlson, Foreman, Has Close Call.

THE DALLES, Or., April 9.—Twenty-four span of horses and mules, including some of the best imported stock in the state, were burned to death between 3 and 5 o'clock last night when the big barn on the Malcolm A. Moody ranch at Tygh Valley was destroyed by fire. The burning barn, which was the largest in the county, and the screams of the animals, which represent about half the loss, were not insured.

The animals in the barn at the time included pure-blood stallions, an English hackney stallion and mare, a Percheron stallion. J. W. Carlson, foreman of the ranch, attempted to rescue the Percheron stallion. He entered the stable, which was a mass of flames, and attempted to calm the maddened animal sufficiently to lead it from the building. The stallion was wild with fright and knocked Mr. Carlson down. He had a narrow escape from being trapped in the burning building but succeeded in fighting his way to safety.

The men had just been in the stables caring for the stock after the day's work and were at supper in the ranch house nearby when the fire was discovered. It had started in the loft and when the doors were opened a volume of smoke and flames burst forth. Apparently it had been smoldering for some time.

WAR FORESEEN BY FOCH

Marshal Tells of Work With British General for Preparedness.

LONDON, April 8.—(British Wireless Service).—That Marshal Foch foresaw the danger before the outbreak of the "war of aggression" is indicated in a letter which he has sent to London to be read at a dinner which the members of the houses of parliament are to give soon after Easter to honor General Sir Henry Wilson, chief of the Imperial general staff. Marshal Foch says: "Long before the war General Wilson and I worked together to prepare for the struggle against the German peril, which we both foresaw. It is due to the success of his mobilization arrangements and his careful and detailed plans for transporting troops that the British army was able to arrive quickly on the battlefield as soon as the government had come to a decision."

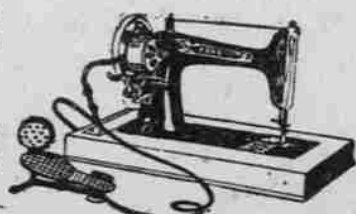
