

## MORE OREGON HEROES REACH EASTERN PORT

Wound Stripes Tell Story of Oversea Fighting.

### BOYS HURRIED TO CAMP

Rudolph Proebstel of Pendleton, Only Sick Soldier Among Arrivals on Luxenback.

NEW YORK, April 16.—(Special.)—We are hearing tales of war as each ship docks and as men wander into town. Monday two halves of the 24th infantry, neither of whom believed the other had survived the Chateau Thierry struggle, asked if they knew George Goode, they said they believed that he was lost at Chateau Thierry. A reunion of the three at Grand Central Palace, where Goode is awaiting transportation, was effected and tales of war were swapped.

One learns from the men of the 21st many stories of the battles. In one company of the 21st there have been 105 sick and wounded and it is likely that on the ships which are carrying sick and wounded are due here within a few days there will be some of those men of the west who bear wounds to attest to the greatness of the regiments.

### MR. HUGHES DENIES STORY

Report of Retention by Tractor Interests Termed Preposterous.

WASHINGTON, April 16.—Charles E. Hughes, in a statement here today, denied flatly that he had been retained by New York traction interests or had received money from them, as had been asserted in testimony before the New York legislative inquiry now in progress. "I have read the preposterous story published in the report of the Albany hearing," said Mr. Hughes, "that I had been paid \$50,000 by the traction interests to appear at the legislative hearing on the Carson-Martin bill. There is not a word of truth in it. I have not been retained by the traction interests and I have not received a dollar from them."

### Jews Fail to Obtain Clause.

NEW YORK, April 16.—The failure of certain Jewish interests to obtain the inclusion of a religious liberties clause in the revised league of nations covenant was announced in a cable message received by the American Hebrew today from the Rev. Isaac Landman, its editor, now in Paris.
