HEARING TO BE CONTINUED.—The hearing of George H. Williams, who has appealed for reinstatement on the teaching force of the Benson Polytechnic school, will be continued this evening at 8 o'clock in Judge Kavanaugh's office in the courthouse. Mr. Williams was discharged from the school by Principal Cleveland some months ago and he appealed for reinstatement and pay for the time he has been out of the school employ.

NEW FOLDER ISSUED BY CHAMBER.—The Portland Chamber of Commerce has issued a new folder to be used by delegates to the imperial council session of the Ancient Arabic Order, Nobles of the Mystic Shrine, at Indianapolis next month. It is profusely illustrated and illuminated with views of Oregon scenes and attractions featuring the Columbia river highway.

WAUGHMITH'S FATE CONSIDERED.—A. G. Clark, manager of the Associated Industries of Oregon, has received communications from Senators Chamberlain and McNary and from Representative McArthur in reply to the telegrams sent urging that the backlogs in Oregon be permanently assigned to Oregon waters.

TRISTE SEKS TRADE HERE.—From Trieste comes an inquiry to the Portland Chamber of Commerce looking to the establishment of a trade relations with this city and state. Anton Topic, engaged in shipbuilding industries, supplies for kindred lines and insurance, with houses in Trieste and Trieste, at the sea outlet for Yugoslavia, Austria and Hungary anticipates there will be a large trade for the Pacific coast region opened up in that part of the world.

PORTLANDERS TO VISIT ROSENBERG.—Portland business men are planning a special car party to attend the Rosenberg strawberry carnival May 23 and 24, with a delegation representing leading jobs and about 100 members of the city. D. T. Honeyman, chairman of the jobs committee of the Chamber of Commerce, has named H. J. Frank, Ralph L. Brackett and W. J. Johnson to represent the jobs interests in making arrangements, to co-operate with a committee from the Associated Industries of Oregon.

VIOLIN RECITAL IS TONIGHT.—At the central library, tonight at 8 o'clock, Robert Louis Barron, head of the violin department of the University of Oregon, will appear in a recital, assisted by Miss Ida May Cook, piano accompanist. There is no charge for admission and the programme includes: Concerto No. 4 in D major (Mozart), Concerto No. 1 in G minor (Max Bruch), "Chant Negre" (A. Walter Kramer), "Humoresque" (Felix Borowicki), "Cradle Song" (Schubert), "Capriccio No. 14 (Paganini-Brown)," "Romance" (Sevenson), "Fantaisie Orientale" (Wieniawski).

MEMBERSHIP CONTINUES TO INCREASE.—So far the present month the membership committee of the Chamber of Commerce has reported additions of 28 new members to the organization. During April 25 new members were added, after the close of the special membership drive and the committee anticipates that the record for this month will be kept up to the average established to date. William J. Sheehy has been elected secretary of the membership committee, in which the newly introduced members are taking a lively interest.

FIGHTING MARINE RETURNS.—Private William L. Carter, Portland, Ore., returned home after spending two years in the Marine corps. He was with the famous 10th company, 2d regiment of Marines, of the second division, which stopped the drive on Paris at Chateau Thierry. He was wounded by five machine gun bullets in the back and has accepted the two-year government course of dairy farming at the University of California starting in September.

WINE SELLER ARRESTED AND FINED.—Guy Bendenelli, an east side Italian, sold a gallon of wine to police officers Sunday, but instead of the fee for such a transfer he was handed a warrant for his arrest on a charge of violating the prohibition law. Yesterday Judge Rosenman of the municipal court fined him \$150. A previous sale to Harry Crossby, which was unwillingly revealed to the police, resulted in the arrest.
