In the junior championships each center—and there are seven of them—Portland, Seattle, Tacoma, Spokane, Lewiston, Corvallis and Eugene—will decide its junior champion, who will compete in the northwest junior championships which will be staged in conjunction with the Oregon state championships at the Laurelhurst club the week of July 14.
