BAKER DENIES CHARGES

NO ATTEMPT TO KEEJ UP MEAT PRICES, SAYS SECRETARY.

Roast Beef and Salt Pork, 250,000. 000 Pounds of It, Not for Ordinary Commercial Trade Here.

WASHINGTON, May 14 .- Secretary Baker denied today there was any relation between any attempt to support the prices of meat supplies in this country and the tentative arrangement reached by representatives of the war department and the packing industry for the disposal abroad of 250,000,000 pounds of canned meat. The depart-ment announced a few days ago that this stock, amounting to the normal output of American packing companies for two years, would be placed on the American market.

"There has been misapprehension with regard to the policy of the department in disposing of meat supplies." the secretary declared in an informal statement. "The meats in question are specially prepared products, in special containers and of a kind never sold commercially in the United States -roast beef and especially salt pork-which are not articles of ordinary commercial trade here. The cans are not even labeled. The question of disposing of these supplies is not one of maintaining price levels—the war de-partment has no interest in that—but finding some way to dispose of




