The minimum salary is to be \$24 a week with a 7 per cent commission for all sales in excess of \$500. The nine-hour day and the six-day week were grant-ed with the understanding that the bakers were to use discretion in mak-ing deliveries on Sundays to hotels and

Ing deliveries on Sundays to hotels and restaurants in emergencies.

Members of the union and master bakers met yesterday afternoon at 4 o'clock and celebrated the settlement of the matter with an exchange of fe-licitations and expressions of mutual interest and good-will.


