DOUGLAS REJECTS MEASURES

Vote Against Reconstruction Program in Roseburg 4 to 1.

ROSEBURG, Or., June 4.—(Special.)—Complete returns from six of the most populous precincts in Roseburg indicate that all of the measures voted on at the special election in Douglas county yesterday were overwhelmingly defeated.

The Roosevelt military highway measure received best support of any on the ballot. Nevertheless that project was voted down by more than two to one.

The heaviest negative vote was cast against the \$5,000,000 reconstruction bonding amendment and reconstruction bonding bill, the former being defeated by more than four to one and the latter by five to one.

Probably no more than one-fifth of the registered voters went to the polls. No returns are available from county districts tonight. Indications are that all issues involved in the election were defeated in Douglas county.

WASCO REJECTS 5 MEASURES

Market, Roads and Roosevelt Highway Indorsed.

THE DALLES, Or., June 4.—(Special.)—The voters of Wasco county at the polls yesterday rejected five reconstruction measures and approved four, according to returns from 29 precincts in the county out of a total of 38. The vote was one of the lightest ever brought out on election day in this county.

The market roads measures received the highest majority. It was indorsed by a vote of 532 to 234. The Roosevelt coast military highway was favored 493 to 469. The measure to raise the county indebtedness limit to 6 per cent so road construction might proceed according to the needs of the counties passed, 520 to 429. The voters favored giving discharged service men financial aid in obtaining education by a vote of 489 to 451.

MEASURES PASS IN MALHEUR

Constitutional Amendments Carried by Substantial Majorities.

ONTARIO, Or., June 4.—(Special.)—With 11 of the largest voting precincts in Malheur county returned, every constitutional amendment and measure voted upon yesterday carried by substantial majorities. The vote was extremely light, but it is believed that reports from outlying precincts will not materially change the results.

The \$5,000,000 bond bill carried by 221 to 85, the 6 per cent limitation by 276 to 75, state bond payment of irrigation and drainage district by 281 to 114, Roosevelt highway by 228 to 189 and the market road bill by 226 to 147.

LINCOLN CELEBRATES RESULT

All Measures Appear Carried Except Lieutenant-Governor.

NEWPORT, Or., June 4.—(Special.)—The heaviest vote ever polled in Lincoln county was cast yesterday with the result, judged from the official

count of about four-fifths of the county, that all the measures passed except the one creating the office of lieutenant-governor, which stands exactly even at present.

The Roosevelt highway passed with about a 16 to 1 vote, there being 1820 voting yes and 78 against the measure.

The county road bill for building a road from Yaquina-bay to the Willamette passed with 1405 for to 151 against.

There was a big celebration in Newport tonight in which residents from Toledo, the Yaquina river valley, Siletz reservation and elsewhere participated to celebrate the victory of the Roosevelt highway and county road.

Opposition voters were represented by a dummy which was burned at the stake in the city park by Siletz Indians in native garments. Lester Martin was chairman of arrangements.

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
