

ALLIES FOSTER NEW REPUBLIC, SAY HUNS

Armies Charged With Supporting Rhenish Movement.

FORCE IN AUSTRIA URGED

Alsace-Lorraine Superior Council Holds First Meeting Under New French Regime.

PARIS, June 5.—(By the Associated Press.)—Count von Brockdorff-Rantzau, head of the German peace delegation, has sent a formal letter of protest to the peace conference, complaining that the armistice of November 11, 1918, was arbitrarily protecting and favoring the individuals who are attempting to establish a Rhenish republic.

The protest adds that the armies also are preventing loyal Germans from manifesting counter-feeling.

VIENNA, June 5.—(By the Associated Press.)—Allied intervention in Hungary to put down the communist government has been urged by Count Julius Andrássy, former Austro-Hungarian foreign minister.

STRASBOURG, June 5.—(French Wireless Service.)—The superior council of Alsace and Lorraine held its first meeting under the new French regime on Monday in the building formerly occupied by the German ministry of the interior. Alexandre Millerand, governor-general, in a speech, said no abrupt change in the laws of the two provinces was contemplated.

BERLIN, June 4.—(By the Associated Press.)—A proclamation by General Maunin, commander of the French army of occupation at Mayence, forbidding strikes against the Rhenish republic and threatening leaders of any such movements with expulsion, is published in the Frankfort Gazette.

BERLIN, June 5.—(By the Associated Press.)—Another indication of sentiment in eastern Germany regarding annexation of portions of east Prussia to Poland is shown in a bitter protest signed by all the leaders of the leading political parties in the Oletzke district, charging the government with neglecting the interests of east Prussia and bartering the province with the entente for more favorable peace terms.

500 PICKERS REACH HOOD

Three Carloads of Strawberries Shipped Daily; Price Firm.

HOOD RIVER, Or., June 5.—(Special.)—The arrival of 500 berry pickers here yesterday temporarily relieved the shortage. Three-fourths of the arrivals were women and children, most of whom proceeded to the Dee Flat country. More than 1000 outside pickers are here now.

For the past five days strawberries have been moving at the rate of three refrigerator cars a day in addition to large express shipments. The call for less than carload lots and the refrigerator shipments to two carloads tonight.

While the crop will fall somewhat short of the last year, it is estimated, the high price in prospect will result in record total returns to the valley for a strawberry harvest. The price remains firm at \$1 and \$1.25 a crate.

I. W. W. ACTIVITY CHARGED

Defense Begun in Case of Alleged High-Seas Murder.

NEW YORK, June 5.—Captain Adolph Pedersen of the bark Puako and his son, who are charged with the murder on the high seas of Axel Hansen, a seaman, began their defense today after Judge Hough, presiding, had announced that he would assist a verdict of murder in the first degree if one were returned by the jury on the ground that the prosecution had failed to show premeditation.

Dudley Field Malone, counsel for the defendants, declared in his opening address to the jury that it was shown that members of the Puako's crew had conspired to kill the captain and his two sons. He declared Hansen was the leader of the mutiny, that he was an I. W. W. agitator, and that during the voyage he had preached his doctrines to the crew.

CASHIER HELD FOR PROBE

Accounts of Rosebud State Bank Said to Show Shortage.

HELENA, Mont., June 5.—Alleging shortages in his accounts, members of the state bank examiner's staff last Monday caused the arrest of W. J. Wallin, recently cashier of the Rosebud State Bank at Rosebud, Montana. It was announced today that it is alleged that Wallin had been speculating in Texas oil wells, but the amount he is said to have extracted from the funds of the bank was not disclosed.

Stability of the market is not endangered by the cashier's reputed shortage. Wallin was a member of the lower house of the fourteenth legislature.

PLUMBING BUSINESS SOLD

Thomas Nickerson of Seattle Buys Gauld Company Supplies.

The wholesale plumbing supply firm of the Gauld company has been purchased by Thomas J. Nickerson of Seattle. Mr. Nickerson is manager of the Seattle branch of the Wolworth Manufacturing company of Boston and it is surmised that the Boston concern is back of the Portland purchase.

No announcement is made as to change of name of the firm. The business will be continued here.

Japanese Buys Fancy Fowls.

TACOMA, Wash., June 5.—(Special.)—Japanese chicken fanciers are importing choice stock from America. Eight Rhode Island Reds were shipped from Tacoma on the Osaka Maru. Kaisha steamer Arakawa Maru that were valued in the ship's manifest at \$350. One fowl alone was valued at \$50. It is said that the movement of choice birds has begun to Japan. Most of the stock is purchased from breeders in the east.

Tribute Paid Philanthropist.

SAN FRANCISCO, June 5.—San Francisco's street railway and city government activities paused three minutes today in tribute to the late Jesse W. Lillenthal, philanthropist, banker and president of the United Railways, during the funeral services.

POSSES PURSUE ROBBER

DISTRICT ATTORNEY DIRECTS CHASE FOR MAN.

Charles Connors, Thief, Reported to Have Taken Refuge Near Ranch in Thief Valley.

BAKER, Or., June 5.—(Special.)—Posses from Baker, Haines, North Powder and La Grande, aggregating about 50 men under the direction of District Attorney W. S. Levens and Sheriff R. P. Anderson of Baker and Sheriff W. A. Koser of Baker, are in pursuit of Charles Connors, alleged highwayman, who on last Wednesday robbed the Bank of Haines of \$250.

Connors was sighted early this morning by officials who have been watching the Cox ranch, owned by the bank's mother's aunt, in Thief valley. The officials here were notified immediately and started for the place.

No word has been received here from any of the posses and it is the belief that the alleged bandit is surrounded. The country where he was seen is rough and it is thought that Connors would have excellent hiding grounds in this vicinity, as there are two abandoned mines within a few miles where he might hide until driven out by want of food.

It was reported early today that shots had been exchanged between one posse and the highwayman, but no confirmation of the rumor has been received.

SINGLE TAX GETS PLACE

Amendment to Be on Ballot at 1920 Election; Petitions Are Approved.

SALEM, Or., June 5.—(Special.)—Petitions presented by the Oregon Single Tax league for a constitutional amendment to be voted on at the 1920 election were approved today by Sam A. Koser, deputy secretary of state. The league, through Harry A. Rice of Portland, president, several weeks ago submitted a form of ballot title which was approved by Attorney-General Brown.

The proposed single tax amendment will now stand a place on the ballot if its sponsors procure the signatures of 3940 voters at least four months prior to the next general election.

JAILBREAKER IS ARRESTED

Lester Sallerwith Held by Officers at Fresno, Cal.

The man who staged one of the most sensational jailbreaks which ever occurred in Portland is under arrest in Fresno, Cal., and probably will be brought here for trial, according to a telegram received by Captain Cleve yesterday. The prisoner is Lester Sallerwith, who broke out of the city jail about two years ago.

Sallerwith had been arrested by In-

spector Russell on a charge of burglary. He was in the cell where prisoners are allowed to converse with friends, when he crawled out through a small hole, reached the outside of the building, and five stories from the ground, crawled around the structure on a four-inch ledge until he reached a fire escape.

Eventually Sallerwith got to the Worcester building, which is a police headquarters, crawled in a window and got away. Sheriff Jones of Fresno arrested him on a charge of robbery, but agreed to turn him over to the Portland police because he lacked evidence to convict him.

DICK McLEAN ALTERS PLEA

Man Held on Statutory Charge Demands Jury Trial.

The plea of guilty entered by Dick McLean to a charge of attacking 16-year-old Esther Long was withdrawn by Attorney Morris A. Goldstein yesterday when Presiding Judge Gatens informed him that he intended to give his client the limit under the law if the plea remained in effect. McLean is a man more than 40 years of age and Judge Gatens declared he had no sympathy with offenders of his type and would not be lenient with him.

Trial by jury will be held the latter part of this month. Deputy District Attorney Pierce protested against allowing the plea to be withdrawn but was overruled.

BANK EMPLOYEES GUESTS

LADD & TILTON CELEBRATES 60TH ANNIVERSARY.

Announcement Made That Samuel L. Eddy and R. S. Howard Are Promoted to Vice-Presidents.

One hundred and fifteen employees of the Ladd & Tilton bank were guests of the officers last night at the Multnomah hotel in commemoration of the 60th anniversary of the pioneer banking house of the Pacific coast.

It was in June, 1859, that the banking house was established on the second floor of the building at 105 Front street. In California D. O. Mills was buying and selling gold dust, but the banking house that bears his name was formed at a later date at Sacramento, and at San Francisco the Bank of California had not been organized when the Portland bank was founded by William S. Ladd and Charles E. Tilton with a capital stock of \$50,000.

Announcement was made last night of the addition of two vice-presidents—Samuel L. Eddy and R. S. Howard, who have been assistant cashiers.

The banquet was informal. Short talks were made by Edward Cookinham, president, and Isaac D. Hurt, vice-president of the bank. After the dinner the party was taken to the Alcazar theater to witness the presentation of the musical comedy, "Mile Modiste."
