

FLOUR BOUGHT FOR EXPORT TO EUROPE

Grain Corporation Obtains About 200,000 Barrels.

LAST PURCHASE OF SEASON

Millers Have but Little to Offer to Government Out of Their Remaining Stocks.

The government has bought the last export flour it will take in this section out of the old crop. Purchases were made yesterday by the grain corporation on the bids recently submitted by northwestern millers.

The coarse grain market was quiet at the local board session. Corn and feed barley were slightly higher, but oats and brown barley were easier.
