In the opinion of Earl Kilpatrick, assistant manager of the northwestern division, who recently wrote to the local officers complimenting them on the splendid work being done here in caring for all service men who pass through the city.

Reading Matter Pleases. Distribution of reading matter is one of the big works of the canteen, and during the week 10,000 magazines were distributed. Towels were furnished to 6070 men.

Work Will Continue. It will be sometime before the Portland canteen is closed. The work will slacken up somewhat in the near future. However, as the Red Cross canteen at railway junction points and other places of the kind in the United States, the Red Cross drill team and the Portland canteen band are two organizations of which the Portland Red Cross leaders are particularly proud.
