

VALD RESERVATION POLICY IS SOUGHT

Lodge Asks Senate to Demand Allied Recognition.

REPUBLICANS BACK MOVE

Definite Declaration by Parties to Treaty Is Desired to Establish Decisions as Binding.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 7.—A determination to stand against any reservations to the peace treaty which do not specifically require acceptance by the other powers before the United States enters the league of nations was voted in senate debate today by republican leaders.

Senator Lodge, chairman of the foreign relations committee, declared that while in general practice a reservation might become void if objected to by the other parties.

The suggestion was seconded by Senator Brandegee, republican, Connecticut, and later Senator Borah, republican, Idaho, declared that "to a certain number" the opponents of unreserved ratification would insist upon such a course.

A proposal by Senator Pittman, democrat, Nevada, that reservations be embodied in a separate resolution and made physically a part of the ratification was opposed by the opposition leaders as "absolutely futile."

The senate adopted a resolution by Senator Walsh, democrat, Montana, asking the judiciary committee whether there were any constitutional obstacles to the ratification of the special treaty with France.

There was much informal discussion among senators over President Wilson's statement on Shantung. Some of the most bitter opponents of the treaty declared the statement gave the president was not sufficient to dispel suspicion of Japan's intentions in the Chinese province.

Provisions of the covenant imposing obligations on congress do not violate the American constitution, and the covenant can be ratified with interlocking reservations without requiring submission to the other nations.

Senator Kellogg said he was "willing to try" the league, though he did not believe it would permanently prevent war. The speaker said there was ample ground for varying guarantees in the covenant which have been objected to on the ground of constitutionality.

"A treaty does not violate the constitution because a violation of a treaty may cause war. The violation of many of our treaties might cause war, if the other party to the treaty so desired."

"It is claimed that we cannot enter into a treaty limiting armament because congress alone has the power to limit armament and provide for a navy. By a treaty with Great Britain in 1817, we agreed to limit armament on the Great Lakes and no question has ever arisen as to its validity."

No Concrete Law to Be Asked. No concrete law clearly defining hoarding and profiteering will be asked, although recommendations will be made for laws designed to bolster up the existing laws under which the attorney-general expects to reach price gougers and hoarders.

The president will ask for an extension of the Lever food control act to make it applicable as a peace-time measure and to include all commodities, shoes, clothing and life necessities, as well as food.

This much as to the contents of the address was learned after President Wilson had called into conference today members of the cabinet and the Palmer sub-committee and revised it to meet their suggestions.

It is considered probable by officers that the president also will suggest the necessity for throwing the "full light of publicity" on the question of costs with a view to enabling the public to protect itself against extortion. This idea may even go so far as to include the marking the cost of manufacture on the article.

The legal department of the government today was actively proceeding with its programme for immediate prosecutions for hoarding and profiteering under existing laws.

Packers' Indictment Sought. United States District Attorney Charles F. Clyde of Chicago, disclosed that the government would ask indictments against the big meat packers when the federal grand jury meets at Chicago three weeks hence. The indictments will be asked under the Sherman anti-trust law and under the Lever food control law for hoarding, he said. Civil suits will be filed also under the Sherman law.

The department of justice today received reports from many district attorneys that they were proceeding with investigations in their territory.

A delegation of postoffice and postal employees left a letter for the president, asking him to recommend that congress

grant wage increases for these employees averaging 50 per cent. Developments today in the government efforts to reduce high living costs included:

Announcement that the action against five big meat-packing firms would be brought under the criminal and civil sections of the Sherman anti-trust law and under the section of the food control act making unlawful the hoarding of food.

Reports from district attorneys over the country that they were proceeding with investigations of profiteering and hoarding and would make arrests wherever facts warranted.

Introduction of another resolution in the senate making the judiciary committee to determine whether it would be advisable to prohibit temporarily the exporting of food, clothing and other necessities.

Granting of authority to the post-office department to increase the parcel post weight limit from 12 1/2 pounds, so as to facilitate the distribution of surplus army foodstuffs to the people.

A report by the Federal Trade commission that stocks of food in storage this year were 20 per cent greater than a year ago despite the fact that prices of practically all foods have shown large increases.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 7.—Authority to increase temporarily the parcel post weight limit to 12 1/2 pounds so that buyers of army food may take full advantage of opportunity to purchase through postmasters and letter-carriers was granted the postmaster-general by the interstate commerce commission. It also was announced that during the sale buyers might place several orders at the same time without paying the initial postal charge of 5 cents a pound or more.

SEATTLE, Aug. 7.—Orders calling for an immediate and thorough investigation of the high cost of living here were received from Washington, D. C., today by District Attorney Robert C. Underwood. A federal probe will be started here to determine if prosecution can be instituted against food hoarding and violators of the anti-trust laws.

MAGYAR WORKERS' FIGHT HELD TRAGIC

Overthrowers of Bolsheviki Menaced by Roumanians.

UNIONISTS SUPPORT ALLIES

Reds Deserted and Ousted by Very Class They Courted, Who Now Are in Grave Peril.

PARIS, Aug. 7.—(Special cable.)—In American eyes the most tragic aspect of the developments in Hungary lies in the blow dealt to Magyar workers who by force of sheer logic overthrew the bolshevik regime of Bela Kun. Every report reaching Paris from Budapest, with the exception of those administered by the Hungarian administration, indicated the sincere desire of the new ministry to establish a democracy with which the allied and associated powers can make a durable peace.

For the first time since Leninism raised its head in Europe, the very folk for whom it was designed have turned against soviet doctrines and have proclaimed their faith in the old economic order.

As the American peace commission knows beyond doubt, it was not the Roumanian advance which precipitated the downfall of Bela Kun, rather it was his impending collapse which permitted the Roumanians to press forward unhindered.

Unionists Down Dictator. The Budapest dictator was hurled from his pedestal by those to whom he had sought to cater, namely, the Hungarian trade unionists. Now these unions are eager to set up a democratic government which will bring peace and economic restoration to their country, and they find themselves crushed under the heel of an invader.

They are ordered to pay the Roumanian conqueror an indemnity which will leave them industrially bound, commercially prostrate and perhaps face to face with starvation.

The terms proposed by Roumania are of course utterly irreconcilable with the armistice conditions. Roumania's ultimatum, moreover, constitutes a violation of the pledges made to the anti-Bela Kun trade unions by the allies, for it is no longer a secret that the Roumanian government is permitted to feed the Hungarians and maintain them, provided they would demobilize the army and submit to the decrees of the allies.

Roumania's Demands Punitive. At the time these promises were made the Roumanian forces were in full retreat before Bela Kun legions. Provisions and other supplies hoarded by the Roumanians can be classed only as punitive indemnity, for they are not needed at Roumania at this time. Roumanians will have surplus food when their harvest is in.

Doubtless the demands are based on the fact that the Roumanians looted Roumania pretty thoroughly in the months preceding the armistice, but the fact remains that if the Roumanians are permitted to continue to loot Roumania, they will have to pay the bill in one way or another.

Food shortage today in Budapest approaches a condition of famine, owing to the refusal of the Roumanians to forward their products to the city. Mr. Hoover's organization had arranged to send food there, but there is little likelihood that this can be done, since whatever might be sent would doubtless be seized by the Roumanians to secure their claims on the Magyar state.

No more critical situation has ever confronted the statesmen assembled in Paris. It will unquestionably be hard to find a solution.

Accounts of the Roumanian proceedings report that they notified the Hungarians yesterday that because the terms of the armistice laid down by the Roumanians ultimatum had not been accepted the Roumanians would cross the Danube immediately, later carrying out their threat.

Roumanians Accused of Assaults. Other acts charged against the Roumanians in the advice to the conference are assaults upon inoffensive persons and the seizure of property elsewhere in Budapest under the pretext of searching for arms.

The Roumanian army is reported by the press to be in the process of collecting farming implements and rolling stock are being sent to Roumania, although Budapest is on the verge of starvation.
