

AIRMEN READY FOR FLIGHT ACROSS U. S.

16 Machines to Leave Coast at 6 This Morning.

72-HOUR RUN IS PLANNED

More Than 60 Planes at Same Time Will Start Westward From Mineola Field.

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 7.—With men and machines turned to the highest degree commensurate with endurance and ability, 16 regular army flyers are to "hop off" here beginning at 6 o'clock tomorrow morning, for a flight they expect will land them at Mineola field, N. Y., 72 hours later. The race will be on when Lieutenant J. P. Reichter of Rockwell field, San Diego, takes the "jump" in his De Havilland for the ascent to the distance flight levels. Then will follow a galaxy of De Havilland "bluebirds." Sopwith experimentalists and two captured German Fokkers, commanded by Lieutenant F. W. Siefert of Rockwell field, had failed to arrive late today and there was a possibility that it would not be here in time to start with the others.

Fokkers Arouse Interest.
The De Havillands will predominate in the race. Army interest seemed to center about the performance of the Fokkers, which were built for but 75 hours' combat service, and whose engines of 180 horse power each, drive through the air at a giddy speed. The Fokkers carry little or nothing in the way of replacements, so if Lieutenant Reichter and Cadet J. A. Cardiff, both of Rockwell field, are "stalled" on the way, in Cardiff's own words, they will be "up against it." The Teuton machines still bear the original markings of the German black cross. They were brought direct to America from St. Mihiel.

There will be 20 control stations, identical with the ones to be used by the flyers from Mineola field. The order in which the men will start was determined by a lottery in western department headquarters today. Lieutenant Edward V. Wales, Eugene, Or., and Lieutenant William Goldsborough, observer, will start tenth.

Official Send-off Given.
The flyers were given an official "send-off" by Mayor James Rolph today. Mayor Rolph sat in the pilot seat of a Fokker and posed in flying regalia for the motion picture and still camera men.

The food and other comforts of the flyers are supplied by the Red Cross. The flyers are traveling as lightly as possible in order to make the objective by Friday evening.

MINEOLA, N. Y., Oct. 7.—Air Commodore L. E. Charlton, air attaché of the British embassy at Washington, was selected tonight as the first aviator to be sent away from here tomorrow morning in the great transcontinental air race and reliability test to San Francisco and return. Commodore Charlton, who is the highest ranking officer entered in the contest, will fly a Bristol machine and will alternate as pilot with Flight Lieutenant P. E. Traill, also of the embassy staff.

Fifty Machines Lined Up.
At sundown tonight 50 machines, representing eight different makes and resembling giant grasshoppers, were lined up on Roosevelt field awaiting the signal of Major-General Thomas H. Barry, commanding the department of the east, which will send them 2700 miles across 11 states. Seventeen other machines had either arrived and were being prepared by mechanics or were on their way here from neighboring fields. Sixteen machines were preparing to essay the eastbound trip from San Francisco. The contest is limited to military aviators.

Commodore Charlton will be sent away promptly at 6 o'clock and one-half of the other machines are scheduled to follow promptly at two-minute intervals. The other half are scheduled to leave in the early afternoon. Word was received here tonight that the first San Francisco entrant would be sent away at 6 o'clock in the morning (Pacific time) which, allowing for the difference in time, would make an almost simultaneous get-away on both eastbound and westbound flyers.

YOUNG MEN HAVE CHANCE

Navy Is Making Drive for Recruits in Aviation Branch.

An opportunity for young men to enter the naval aviation service is

now offered. Recruiting offices for this branch of the service have been opened in conjunction with the regular recruiting station in the Dekum building at Third and Washington streets.

Ensign T. Burke Lee of the naval aviation service has arrived in Portland to take charge of the recruiting work. He was one of the flyers in Portland with the naval seaplanes during the rose festival.

Ensign Lee will maintain the aviation recruiting station in this city for two months. The navy is making a drive for recruits in the aviation branch and the Oregon quota will be limited only to the number of young men who desire to enlist.

HIGHT LIVING IS TOPIC

PROFESSOR HERING TALKS ON CHRISTIAN SCIENCE.

Thinking People Find That Healing Work of Early Church Yet Possible, Says Lecturer.

Professor Hermann S. Hering, C.S.B., member of the board of lectureship of the mother church, the First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Boston, Mass., last night delivered a lecture entitled "Christian Science, The Science of Right Living," in First church edifice.

Today thinking people are beginning to see as they have not seen before, that the healing work of the early church is yet possible, although this healing work rebukes the generally accepted supremacy of material law, he said. They perceive that there is such a thing as spiritual law, a law apart from physics; that this divine law is and should be a governing over what is termed matter, and all this in the spirit of the Christian Science thought which declares that any existence apart from the material cannot be conceived. It is encouraging that Christian peoples are beginning to awake out of their sleep and to assert their right to the freedom and harmony of the children of God.

Mrs. Edy's supreme declaration is this, that there is one infinite mind which is wholly good, perfect, indestructible, immortal. This infinite, absolute, omnipresent, omnipotent being is the incorporeal father-mother god whose true nature is revealed through Christian Science. This divine actuality is the scientific basis on which all Christian Science healing is demonstrated. The divine principle whose everpresence is utilized in the overcoming of sin and sickness, through the available transforming power of the Christ, coming to the human consciousness.

Christian Science explains the true nature of the "evil" created man, as not the man created of the dust of the ground but the image and likeness of the Father, a man whom God pronounced good and to whom he gave dominion over the earth.

But if all reality is spiritual and perfect, there arises the question "what of evil, material, discordant conditions?" Here Christian Science declares that "evil," as cause spirit, the absolute good, is infinite, and "evil," as effect, can be but for either evil or matter, and it therefore classifies all phenomena and all experiences which are material and discordant as being untrue, for truth is indestructible.

Christian Science healing brings about not merely a physical change, but improves the patient morally, mentally and spiritually. It brings a man nearer to God and changes his standpoint from a material to a spiritual basis. In this thought, gives him power over evil, and improves his whole being in the degree that he can grasp the truth.

Mrs. Edy's one objective through many years was to know God, to find the infinite source of good to understand the true nature of being, that healing might come to burden-bearing humanity. Her single-mindedness, unswerving by the world, undimmed by the weakness of the flesh, undaunted by the enmity of evil, held her true to her ideal and brought her to the longed-for goal, the demonstrable working understanding of the Christ-method, with unmistakable signs following.

At laundry union headquarters yesterday the women were going about their work of directing the pickets with more confidence as a result of the presence in the city of their international president.

Laundry owners still insist they are getting out their work in spite of the strike and maintain they can go on indefinitely, if need be.

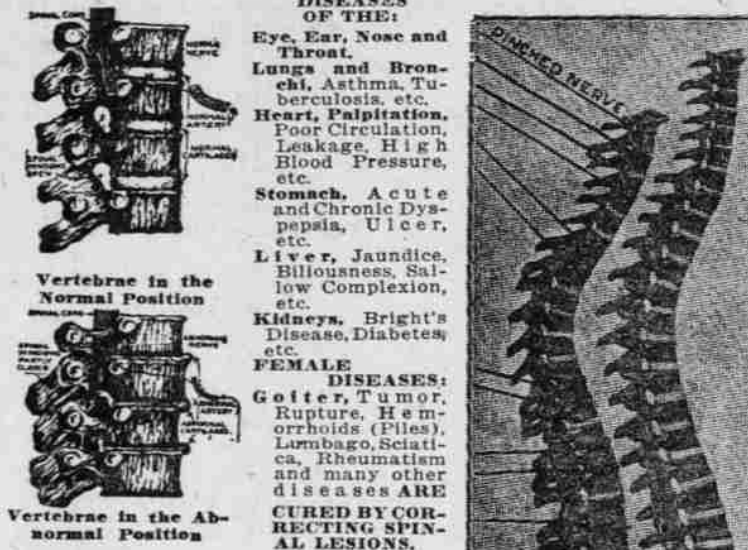

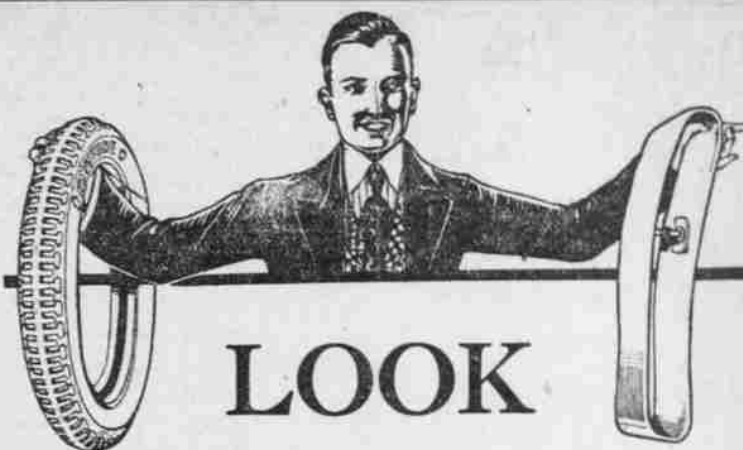
