Fall Fishing Season Poor. ASTORIA, Oct. 18.—(Special)—The fall fishing season at the coast streams, which will close next Thursday, November 20, has been one of the poorest in the history of the coast. The recent rains are expected to increase the runs on account of the freshets. On the Columbia river the conditions have been similar. The pack thus far is only approximately 150,000 cases, more than half of which are chums.
