

BLAND EXAMINED ON CENTRALIA MATTERS

Prisoner Questioned 2 Hours by Prosecuting Attorney.

OLE HANSON NOW SOUGHT

Captured Suspect Says He Did Not Go to Hannaford Headquarters Following Shooting.

CENTRALIA, Wash., Nov. 19.—At least a dozen cigarette aids Bert Bland, Armistice day murderer suspect, and one of the principals in the quadruple crime committed by local I. W. W., according to the state, through the two hours' examination he underwent this morning in the county jail at Chehalis. Seated in a small room at the sheriff's office, the prisoner, who was captured yesterday, was closely questioned by Herman Allen, prosecuting attorney, and E. D. Cunningham, assistant prosecutor.

Prisoner Wants Shave.

Though the right to refuse a statement was conceded, the state desired his photograph and he was led to the courtyard to pose for the camera man. With a week's growth of beard, his tousled reddish hair brushed up in the characteristic fashion that has become the sobriquet of "curly" and dressed in the staggard trousers and rough smock of a longer, Bland submitted to the ordeal with poor grace, insisting that he should be permitted to have a shave and a haircut.

We can make no statement of what Bland told us during the inquiry," said Prosecutor Allen, "not at this time, anyway. But there is no harm in revealing that he never went to the Hannaford headquarters, where the police were seeking him. After the Armistice day shooting Bland made his way east of Centralia and then to the northwest. He was with Ole Hansen, another suspect against whom the state has evidence warranting the murder charge, until the Sunday night when they parted. Posses are now searching for Hansen."

6 MONTHS' SESSION ENDS

Short Recess Possible, as Regular Congress Will Open Dec. 1. Members Leave for Homes.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 19.—Six months to the day after congress convened in special session, the house formally adjourned at 4:02 P. M. today, after receiving word from President Wilson that he did not object to this action.

The adjournment resolution was adopted by a vote of 55 to 5. Only a short recess will be possible, as congress reconvenes in regular session December 1. Many house members had left for home before the formal adjournment and only 60 were present when the committee sent to inform the president of the situation.
