

STEELERON CLAUSENS TAKES WORK TODAY Northwest Steel Shipyard Launching Last Vessel.

MRS. R. L. BANKS SPONSOR Outfitting Should Be Completed by January 1, When Plant Will Be Closed.

The \$800-ton steel steamer Clausenus, thirty-ninth and for the time being at least, the last hull of the Northwest Steel company, will go down the ways at 4 o'clock this afternoon. The yard will close with the delivery of this vessel to her owners.

The vessel to be launched today is the third built on private account by the Northwest Steel company since the completion of its government programme. The first was the steamer H. Gordon, purchased by the United Sulphur company.

The second private vessel of the Northwest Steel company is the steamer Centaurus, which is expected to be delivered to the Columbia-Pacific Shipping company today for operation in the Gulf of Mexico.

No trade has been assigned as yet for the steamer Clausenus, which is to be launched today.

The steamer Centaurus, soon to be delivered to the Green Star line by the Columbia River Shipbuilding corporation, has already been allocated by her owners to take a full cargo of lumber to Australia.
