The proposed injunction, which is a sweeping one, is believed to be the first of its kind ever used to curb the activities of any men or group of men. It mentions as defendants, 60 alleged L. W. W. now in jail awaiting trial on charges of criminal syndical-

trial on charges of criminal syndical-ism under a state law "and all oth-ers not now known whose names and identity may hereafter be disclosed, associating, confederating, affiliating and acting in concert with said named defendants, as members of an organization commonly known and called Industrial Workers of the

Under the injunction's terms any man who advocated the principles of the I. W. W. by word of mouth or by circulating literature of the organi-zation would be adjudged in conopt of court and punished accord-

The complaint refers to the Armiwhice day tragedy at Centralia. Wash, when four members of the American Legion were shot down and killed, and alleges that continued preachings of the Industrial Workers of the World will result in further lawlessness and destruction life and property.


