WEST HARTLAND IS BOE

STEAMER WILL BE BROUGHT UP UNLESS FOG PREVENTS. Union Oil Company Tanker Lashing Unable to Leave Gasco; Montage Held at Dock.

The steamer West Hartland, which is carrying a large quantity of crude rubber from the orient, was due to arrive at Astoria at 2 o'clock this morning, according to advices received here yesterday by the Columbia river pilots. Arrangements were made immediately to bring the steamer up the river for fog in the river should prevent this.

Advices from Astoria were that the steamer was held at the pier but further upstream, especially in the vicinity of St. Helens and up as far as the lower Portland harbor, the fog was still hampering navigation. With the exception of the steamer Rose City, which left dock at 3 o'clock last night, practically all vessels were prevented from moving by the heavy fog which still was prevailing.

The crude rubber, forming a part of the cargo of the West Hartland, will be shipped to Seattle, where it is received in Portland. The vessel has aboard between 6000 and 8000 tons of this rubber, in addition to a quantity of Manila hemp and tobacco and general oriental cargo. The rubber cargo was taken aboard at Singapore and the steamer is to be reloaded with cargo intended for importers in the east.

The West Hartland, which is in the Portland harbor, is the property of the Pacific Steamship company, originally was intended to land her cargo at Seattle. However, she was re-routed to this port at the request of Pacific Steamship agent here, several days ago.

The steamer Namhan, which has just completed a cargo of flour at the elevator, is to have left dock yesterday. Owing to the fog, however, it was decided to have her wait for fair weather.

The Union Oil tanker Lansing, which at Gasco, was unable to get away after unloading cargo on account of heavy fog, is to be reloaded with cargo, which was to have moved from the St. Johns terminal to the Union Oil dock at Gasco, also, was unable to move yesterday.
