

MOTHER RECOVERS CHILD
PARENT AWARDED CUSTODY
OF DAUGHTER, AGED 9.

Court Orders Release of Francis
Hulm From Convent When Sis-
ters Offer No Defense.

SALEM, Or., Dec. 30.—(Special.)—
Judge G. G. Bingham in the circuit
court here today ordered the Benedic-
tine sisters, who conducted the Benedic-
tine academy at Mount Angel, to re-
lease from that institution Francis
Hulm, aged 9 years, who was placed
in the school recently by her father.

Mr. and Mrs. Hulm and daughter
arrived at Mount Angel December 31
from North Dakota, and after leav-
ing the child at the school Mr. Hulm
issued instructions that she was not to
be released to her mother or any
other person without his consent. Mr.
and Mrs. Hulm then left Mount Angel
but the mother returned a few days
later and demanded custody of her
child.

Upon refusal of the Benedictine sis-
ters to accede to the demand of Mrs.
Hulm she instituted mandamus pro-
ceedings in the circuit court here to
have the child released. No defense
was made in court by the Benedictine
sisters, other than to introduce evi-
dence to show that in refusing to re-
lease the child they were acting on
instructions of her husband.

Mrs. Hulm and her daughter left
tonight for Oregon City, where they
expect to make their home.
