**FOREST AVIATORS TO TRAIN**—Five forest service men from Oregon and Washington will go to March field at San Diego about February 20 to take part in a conference of rangers and aviation officers. This will virtually take the form of a school and is intended to instruct those who handle the forest planes as to the means of communication between the machines and the ground. Observing rangers designated to represent this territory are William Naylor of Eugene, C. W. Boyce of Portland, M. Graves of Grants Pass, C. B. Neal of Portland and L. F. Chartrand of Wenatchee, Wash. All have considerable experience with planes and Boyce was engaged in map work for the army aviation service during the war.

**SUICIDE INTENT IS DENIED**—A declaration that he had no intention of committing suicide by leaping into the river from the Hawthorne-avenue bridge Thursday night, is made by Carl Piacentini, who was found by a passing pedestrian prone on the sidewalk, evidently in a faint. A note that was found tucked to the railing said he was tired of life and wished to die. Yesterday, upon being released from the emergency hospital, the young man explained that after being given a drink at his lodging on the east side, he was taken ill and while stupor, wrote the note and lay down on the bridge, lying down when he saw a man approaching. He denies ever having any quarrel with his sweetheart. He served in an artillery outfit through four battles overseas, he stated.

**RAIL RIVALRY ADVOCATED**  
**WILLIAM SPOULE FAVORS OLD-TIME COMPETITION.**  
 President of Southern Pacific Is Against Cummins Bill and Guarantees of Incomes to Roads.

William Sproule, president of the Southern Pacific company, who yesterday noon addressed business men of the city at a luncheon in the main dining room of the Chamber of Commerce, took a firm stand against proposed legislation of a restrictive nature, such as the Cummins bill now before congress and enactments tending to guarantee incomes to railroaders. He declared himself unqualifiedly in favor of open, competitive operation of all lines on the fundamental basis of initiative and ability.

Mr. Sproule made no announcements as to future plans of the company, but the return of the State of Oregon to the control of the roads, going back into private control March 1, was best handled. He was in favor of a "hands off" policy for the government, opposed much pending legislation, and expressed the belief that the best way for the companies themselves to return to the old, sound basis of business initiative and competition.

Mr. Sproule expressed great pleasure at being in Portland and the northwest again. He has been in the northwest for the last several years, and today will go over the Coos Bay road, and the return of the State of California probably Sunday or Monday.
