A check of the list, however, failed to reveal anything. The only new development yesterday was the fact that the packages apparently had been thrown from the bridge at different times. If this is the case it is believed that the crime could not have been committed far from the bridge.

The theory that the packages might have been thrown from a passing auoblie is discredited owing to the fact that the sidewalk on the bridge prevents an automobile from approaching near the guide rail of the bridge.






