This is the outcome of a series of indignation meetings held during the present year by the local grade teachers as a result of the low salaries they are receiving, alleged to be lower than those of teachers in any city in the state in Eugene's class, and of lack of harmony between the superintendent and some of the supervisors on one side and of the supervisors on one side and the grade teachers on the other. In a statement issued to the press, the teachers say:
"The teachers agree that harmony

"The teachers agree that harmony with the present administration is out of the question; that without harmony no progress in the schools can be expected."

Superintendent Rutherford has been on a leave of absence since last fall, taking a course at Stanford university, He is expected early next month.

Leading physicians state that in their opinion the ban may be lifted in a week or ten days, as they ex-pect the peak of the epidemic to be pect the peak of the epidemic to be reached very soon, judging from the fact that it is subsiding in other towns of the valley.

The University of Oregon is still in session, not being affected by the order of the local health board.


