Millions Suffer From Physical Defects Mostly Remediable, Declares Eastern Educator.

CLEVELAND, Feb. 24 .- The lives of CLEVELAND, Feb. 24.—The lives of hundreds of thousands of persons are sacrificed annually, human power immeasurably wasted and staggering economic loss results from the failure to apply scientific knowledge to the provention of needless weakness, diseases and death, said Dr. Thomas D. Wood, professor of physical education at Columbia university, New York, addressing the National Council of Education today. The council is of Education today. The council is composed of 120 of the leading edu-cators of the country attending the National Education association con-

"Our schools are wasting enormous sums in trying to educate children handlcapped by ill health," Dr. Wood said. "Seventy-five per cent, or 16,-000,000 school children of the United States, have physical defects which are mostly remediable. This shows that the business of keeping the school children of the country in good physical condition is a disgrace to the

Josephine Corliss Preston of Olympia, Wash, president of the National Education association, said a substan-tion galary increase was necessary to secure trained and competent teach-ers to fill 25,000 vacancies and replace teachers below professional standards in ability.


