Seven PAY MOONSHINE FINE—Seven alleged moonshiners escaped possible prosecution yesterday when they agreed to contribute \$4000 to the internal revenue department and thus forestalled the return of possible criminal indictments against them. Under the revenue laws, a violator can pay a cash penalty into the internal revenue department and escape criminal prosecution. The seven men who took advantage of this provision were Ned McDonald, Dick Slow, George Chin, Chris Carlson, Sam S. Danich, C. O. Hoyt and Tony Gattuccio.

TWO SMALL FIRES DAMAGE—Fire which started from sparks from the chimney, driven by the wind yesterday morning, did about \$400 damage to the roof of a building at 812 South Willamette boulevard. Furniture owned by J. A. Campbell, who occupied the place, was damaged an additional \$100. The building is owned by G. W. Waterbury of Woodburn, Or. Engines 22 and 24 put out the flames. A fire over the grocery store of M. Bernstein, 554 Sixth street, did about \$50 damage yesterday morning.

THYRON POSTER BAIL BOND—By posting an additional \$5000 bail bond, C. L. Bryon, under indictment and conviction for land fraud operations, procured a stay of execution yesterday in federal court, and was released under the additional bond. The total bond now amounts to \$10,000. Bryon was convicted in the federal court at Seattle for the same offense and is under sentence to McNeil's island. He is to return again to Seattle next week, where he will face trial on a similar charge.

LAQUOR SUSPECT ON TRIAL—Trial of John Svenson of Astoria, an alleged moonshiner, was started yesterday before a jury in Federal Judge Bean's court. Svenson is alleged to have operated a still and dealt in the moonshine liquor prior to his arrest by revenue inspectors, November 18. He insists he knew nothing about the still which is said to have been found on his premises. The case should reach the jury by noon today.

TWO CHINESE FINE—Foo Wing, Chinese, arrested Thursday night after he is said to have sold a quantity of opium by Patrolman Spaulgh. Both gave notice of appeal, and Wong's bail was placed at \$400 and that of Wong at \$200.

BILL POSTER ARRESTED—H. J. Walker, bill poster, was arrested by Patrolman C. G. Crampion yesterday on a charge of posting advertisements without a permit. The arrest is the result of a campaign which has been started by the police against promiscuous posting of bills. Announcement has been made that the laws regulating the posting of bills must be enforced.

RAILWAY OFFICE TO REOPEN—It was announced yesterday that R. W. Foster, formerly in charge of the Chicago, Burlington and Quincy offices in Portland before government ownership became effective, will open an office for that company here next week. Other lines are to take similar action, according to general belief in railroad circles.

MERCHANTS ACCUSED BY WOMAN—Wilbert Turner, 21, a Portland merchant, was arrested at Sixth and Morrison streets yesterday by Detectives Hellyer and Leonard and was held on a charge of contributing to the strike of the best floral decorated car in the vehicle parade during Rose Festival will be bestowed upon the winner personally by Mr. Kendrick, who is imperial potentate. He will also ride in the car during the pageant.
