A \$50,000 station and equipment conveniences will be built in the imnediate future by the Oregon-Washington & Idaho Aeroplane company on its aviation field at Guild's lake, the contract for construction to be awarded probaby this week and about awarded product this week and about 20 planes will be added, routes to Seattie, Astoria and Seaside will be established as soon as feasible and a regular Columbia river highway trip will be inaugurated with hydro-plane about June 1.

Such was the decision of the exec Such was the decision of the executive committee of the board of directors at a session heid in the office of Julius L. Meler, president of the company, yesterday afternoon. That the organization has determined to branch out into the tri-state field on a hig scale, was the assertion of Mr. Meler after the meeting.

Flights to Be Dally. Victor Vernon was elected as man-ager of the company and O. K. Jefy as assistant manager. Branch loss will be established all over the three northwestern states, it was an-nounced, and solicitations of business a scale similar to that conducted railroads will be inaugurated im-

mediately. The company now has a fleet of eight Curtiss ships on its field at Guild's lake, making regular flights over the city, and Mr. Vernon announced yesterday that, beginning at once, a plane will soar above th

We want to prove to the people of this city and others who may be vis-itors here that our planes are rella-ble and can fly in any kind of weathhic and can fly in any kind of weather and are a dependable conveyance, said Mr. Vernon. "By sending a ship over the business section each noon at 7 and 9. we will notify the people that it is the luncheon hour and they won't need to look at their timepleces." The company is eager to inaugurate

its trips to Astoria and Scaside, and has made a number of flights over the route, which follows the river except where it bends. Watson East-man, a director in the company, was a passenger last Saturday, when Pilot Hill made the journey in 1 hour and 22 minutes. The weather was fairly good and the altitude, save when passing through Rainler and whe traveling along the main streets of Astoria, was 2200 feet. 
