

TRAFFIC REGAINED APPROVED
Portland Yards Reported All Men Needed on Hand.
EMBARGO IS STILL FIRM
Perishables and Carload Shipments Not Yet Accepted—Strike in South Said to Be Breaking.

Improved outlook in the transportation situation of Portland with regard to the strike of outland switchmen was reported by operating officials of the railroad yesterday. The number of men working on the day shift was unchanged at the Albina yard and Union station.

51 Men Reported at Work.
Check of the men reporting for duty showed that 51 men of the crews on duty at the beginning of the strike were working. The additional crews that were doing the switching were composed of men from other lines of railroad work or of new men.

At the request of the strikers, Superintendent Washburn held conferences with the employees of the North Bank who were out on strike, but the attending was no sign that no progress was made.

Weight Trains Are Moved.
The Oregon-Washington line sent five freight trains out yesterday and four were received. Six crew shifts were working on the day shift, one on the second shift and none on the late night shift.

The Dalles Strikers Still Out.
THE DALLES, Or., April 13.—(Special.)—Despite the fact that no strikers have returned to work in the local yards, freight trains are being moved. Three freights were sent through the city today and four freights were received yesterday.
