BALKAN CONTRAST SHOWN

BULGARIA GARDEN COUNTRY.
THRACE DESERT.

Associated Press Correspondent, on
Airplane Trip, Notes Differing
Aspects of Countries.

ADRIANOPLE, European Turkey, April 14.—(By the Associated Press.)—The contrast between the thorough cultivation of the Hungarian and Bulgarian fields and those of Thrace was strikingly visible to the Associated Press correspondent, who was the first passenger in the airplane postal and passenger service from Bucharest to Adrianople, instituted by the French because of the demoralization of land traffic. What was a week's journey by land was made in a few hours by air.

Claude Gonnin, a French army aviator, took the correspondent along the Danube country to the Black sea, zig-zagging across Bulgaria, where the fields were laid out like gardens, giving color to the assertions of the Bulgarians that 98 per cent of their people are working. Tilled ground was observed on the tops of mountains. Once the frontier was crossed into Thrace, there came a change; the fields were ragged and only here and there were a few flocks of sheep and herds of cattle grazing. In Thrace the roads were bad, compared with the long clean stretches in Bulgaria. Along the Thracian roads were groups of wagons, apparently bound for Bulgaria. The opinion was voiced by some persons that the lack of economic activity in Thrace is due to uncertainty as to how it is to be disposed by the peace conference. All the territory east of Xanthi is still occupied by French troops.

CZECH LAWMAKERS NAMED

Social Democrats Lead in Election in Several Districts.

WASHINGTON, April 22.—The results of the elections of Sunday and Monday for the house of representatives of Czechoslovakia are announced in cable dispatches received by the Czechoslovakian legation here. They show that the social democrats lead in the Bohemian, Slovakian and German localities. Elections for the senate will be held next Sunday.

BAKER HEN INDUSTRIOUS

Three Eggs Laid in One Day by Cross-Bred Chicken.

WIFE GUILTY OF PERJURY

Mrs. Alice Woodcock Convicted on Nine Counts of Perjury.

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., April 22.—Mrs. Alice Woodcock last night was found guilty on nine counts of perjury in connection with her testimony

at the trial of her husband, Edgar Woodcock, on a charge of having murdered Edward Kelly, a newspaper man. Woodcock was acquitted and later both he and his wife were indicted for perjury. Woodcock now is a fugitive.

Denim Move Reaches Alberta.
CALGARY, Alberta, April 22.—The overall movement has reached the

mountain country of northwest Canada. One hundred girls employed by the Alberta telephone systems have decided to wear plain gingham gowns on and after May 1.

New York Fixes Hours.
ALBANY, N. Y., April 22.—The eight-hour day for women and minors and the minimum-wage bill for women
