SHIP PROCEEDS TO EAST

'Hope and Conjecture' Held to Be Only Evidence.

COURT HEARING IS TODAY

Representatives of Plants Plan Vigorous Defense to Attack of Government Operatives.

With the declaration that the present government investigation of local shipyards is nothing more than a "fishing expedition," based solely on hope and conjecture, representatives of local plants and shipyards which have drawn fire from the department of justice, are planning a vigorous defense when the government's initial attack is launched this morning in federal court.

This investigation, which started early this month when department of justice operatives arrived quietly in Portland, will reach a climax when the United States Attorney Humphreys will file a petition in the United States court this morning asking that the Northwest Steel company and the Columbia River Shipbuilding corporation be required to produce all their books and records before the federal court.

Dan J. Maloney and W. Lair Thompson, attorneys for the two shippers, are expected to spring a surprise or two when this petition comes up for argument either before Judge Wolvort or Judge Bean. It is understood they have amassed evidence, affidavits and other forms of proof to show that the department of justice is not in possession of corroborative evidence to indicate irregularities of any kind in either of the two shipbuilding corporations.

Although the investigation has been under way for more than a month, the only thing thus far brought to light is the fact that these two shippers, which have paid the sum of \$12,500 to Captain John P. Blair, former western manager of the shipping board, Blair is now under indictment on charges of irregularities connected with his administration as shipping board manager.

In a public statement issued last week, officials of the shipbuilding industry and the government gave out these payments of money to depart-ment of justice operatives. They insisted that the shipbuilders had made every effort to conceal anything from the government officials. This money, the statement showed, was paid to Blair for his services as an engineer and inspector after he had severed his relations with the shipbuilders. Blair had been an agent for the shipbuilders since he reached the city in 1917. It is said that these payments were not unreasonable or excessive.

The government petition this morning will be brought to the attention of the United States court in the records of the Columbia River Shipbuilding corporation relative to its operations in the Columbia river. Blair's services as an engineer and inspector after he had severed his relations with the shipbuilders. Blair had been an agent for the shipbuilders since he reached the city in 1917. It is said that these payments were not unreasonable or excessive.

Both United States Attorney Humphreys and representatives of the two shipbuilders have reported that no such statement, or that Blair's closure had come under his observation since the probe first started.
