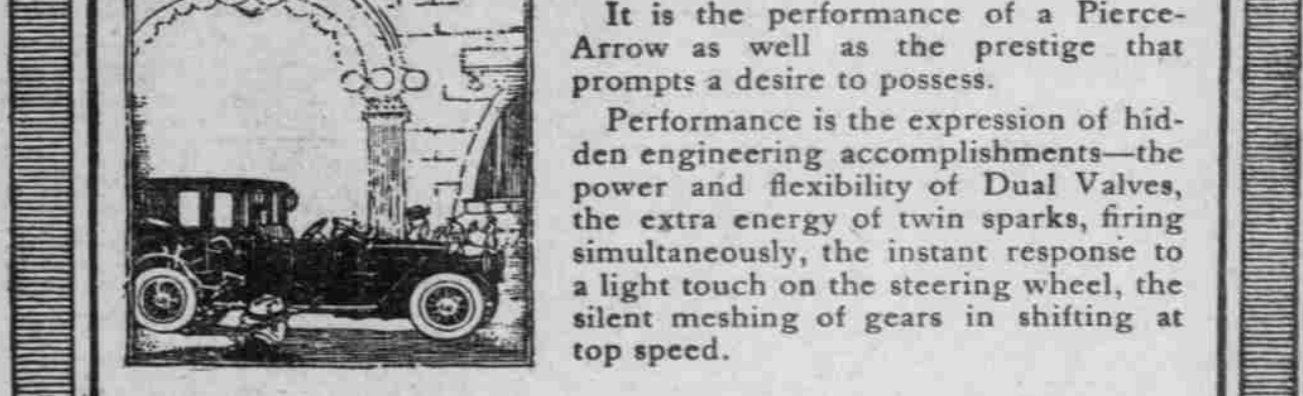
Crew Heaviest in Years.
