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ATHLETES ON WAY TO STANFORD MEET

Crew of Washington College Stops Off in Portland.

TWO SLIGHTLY INJURED

More Than One Hundred Men Entered From Six Institutions on Pacific Coast.

Extensive plans are being made by Stanford athletic managers for the annual Pacific coast conference track and field meet under the auspices of the Palo Alto Institution Saturday afternoon. More than 100 track men, representing six universities and colleges on the Pacific coast, will be entered in the meet, which will conclude the western collegiate track season.

Dr. W. J. Bohler, Washington State college track coach, stopped off here yesterday on his way to the big meet with eight of his best men in tow. He expects to arrive in Palo Alto Saturday afternoon. With him are: B. Howell, hurdles; Al Miller, sprints; Elton Jenne, pole vault and high jump; Fred Hamilton, discus, and C. King, shot put.

Two Men on Injured List.
Miller and Jenne have been on the injured list, but are expected to be in shape for Saturday.

The University of California, Stanford university, the University of Washington, Oregon Agricultural college, Washington State college and the University of Oregon are sending the pick of their track stars to compete in this meet. Practically every important Pacific coast collegiate track star is expected to be in the United States in the Olympic games at Antwerp next summer will be in action.

Last year's meet was won by the University of California, whose team will put in a strong bid for first honors again this year. Stanford, however, made so far this season by Stanford and the Oregon Agricultural college indicate that these two teams will be among the strongest in the conference.

Records Likely to Fall.
With such men as Sprott, Majors, Merchant and Grunsky of California; Kirby, Ellis and Tevelton of Stanford; Swan of Oregon Agricultural college; Jenne of Washington State college; and Pope of the University of Oregon, it is expected that there should be keen competition in every event. Several records are likely to fall.

Robert Sproul will be clerk of the course and the starting pistol will be handled by Coach Francis Warren, a heavy light-weight amateur boxer last Monday night in San Francisco, and slammed him all over the ring.
